Today a Savior is born for us. We are not employing an empty, conventional expression; rather we mean that God offers us 'today,' now, to each one of us, the possibility of acknowledging and receiving Him like the shepherds in Bethlehem, so that He might be born in our lives and renew them, illumine them, transform them by His grace.

Let us joyously live the feast of Christmas. Let us live this beautiful event: the Son of God again is born 'today'; God is truly close to each one of us, and He wants to meet us — He wants to bring us to Himself. Let us live Jesus' birth by contemplating the path of God's immense love.

The celebration of Christmas is not supposed to be merely a memory of a past event but a mystery and a presence of Jesus today. The incarnation of Jesus that began at the annunciation and was announced to the world on Christmas didn't end at Jesus' ascension, but continues still, as he keeps his promise, "I will always be with you until the end of the world." The Light that began to shine in Bethlehem has never been extinguished. It continues to shine around us tonight. It continues to reach those who walk in darkness, the shadow of sin, fear, depression, broken hearts, fractured families. That light continues to reach us because the same Child who, 2022 years ago, was adored by the shepherds in a cave in Bethlehem, never stops visiting, loving, healing us in our daily life. Jesus continues to be born for us 'today', and for that reason fills each of us today with hope.

Jesus Christ is truly Emmanuel, God-with-us now, God-with-us today, and that's why we have nothing to fear. He has entered the world and never left.

"Joy to the world! The Lord is come! Let earth receive her King! Let every heart prepare Him room." Christ is born for us today! *Gloria in excelsis!*

The Holy Innocents (1st c.) are the children mentioned in the account of Jesus' birth in Matthew's Gospel (2:16-18). When the Magi came to Jerusalem to find and adore the

Baby Jesus, the newborn King of the Jews, King Herod requested that they inform him of the Child's location under the pretense of offering Him adoration, too. After paying the Child homage and offering Him their gifts, the Wise Men were warned in a dream not to betray Jesus' location, and departed for their home country by another route.

Meanwhile the Holy Family was warned by an Angel to flee into Egypt. King Herod fell into a jealous rage over the Magi's failure to report back to him. He ordered all the baby boys aged two years and under to be killed, according to the appearance of the Bethlehem Star to the Three Wise Men, in an attempt to kill the Baby Jesus. These baby boys died not only for Christ, but in His stead. The Church venerates them as martyrs. It is uncertain how many children were killed, whether a small number, or in the thousands. The Latin Church instituted the feast of the Holy Innocents in the fifth century. The Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls in Rome is believed to possess the bodies of several of the Holy Innocents. Their feast day is commemorated on December 28th.

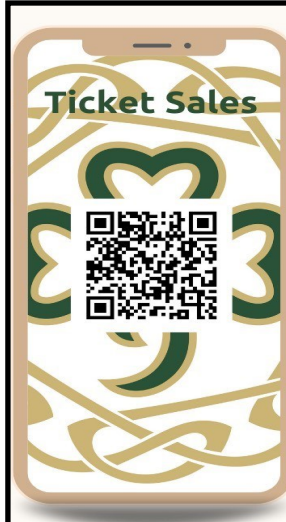
