FROM OUR PASTOR, REV. CANON COMMINS

Dear Faithful and Friends,

It is interesting, maybe surprising or encouraging, perhaps incomprehensible but certainly relevant that the first miracle of Our Lord was that of changing water into a delicious wine, at a wedding feast at Cana. However, that miracle, that extraordinary transformation is only a little preview of a deeper reality, of a deeper transformation for human kind. A deeper reality has to be considered while reading this passage from the Gospel of Saint John, that is, the Sacrament of Marriage.

“Marriage is a great sacrament, I say, in Jesus Christ and in His Church (Eph. 5:32). It is honourable to all (Heb. 13:4) persons, in all and in everything, that is, in all its aspects.”

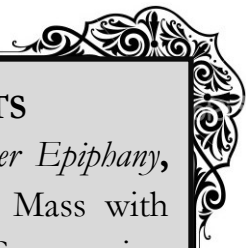

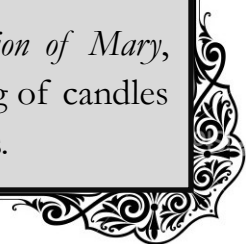
