Dom Guéranger writes: Thus did God, in His power over men's hearts, procure a triumph for His Son, and in the very city which, a few days later, was to clamor for His Blood. Each of these events is an acknowledgment of the kingship of Jesus; the first, from the Gentiles; the second, from the Jews. THE EASTER VIGIL: AN AFTERNOON LITURGY?

Continuing our explanations of the Easter Vigil, it is interesting to note that in more recent times, the Easter Vigil seems to have taken the precedence over Easter Sunday itself, with no serious liturgical reasons, leaving churches almost empty on Easter Sunday, although it is well understood that the Easter Vigil was a penitential ceremony, with less music than any other Mass, with the twelve long readings, the reception of catechumens, etc.

A conflict arises when it comes to the question of whether one fulfils one's Sunday Obligation or not. Two things must be considered. First, the recently given permission, regarding the idea of the 'anticipated Mass,' according to which attending Mass any time after 4pm on Saturday fulfils the obligation. Second, when following the traditional liturgy in use prior to 1955, we understand that the Vigil was never an anticipation of the Feast but truly and properly a Vigil, a preparation (see last week's bulletin) in which case the Easter Mass had to be attended by all as well, giving all its glory and solemnity to the latter. Today, the choice is left to the faithful, with no risk here of sinning.

"A very ancient and powerful tradition called "TENEBRÆ" was seriously affected when the Holy Week ceremonies were moved to the evening. Other devotions (e.g. "Seven Last Words") were also similarly affected."

As Christ did not reveal himself to all after His Resurrection, not even to His apostles, so does the liturgy express this gradual revelation, with the Vigil as a **preparation**, a keeping watch, and the Easter Mass as a **participation**, *"Christ is risen from the dead, by death, trampling upon death..."*, as sung in this *Byzantine Easter hymn par excellence, in the Matins of Easter Sunday.*
