FROM OUR PASTOR, REV. CANON COMMINS

Dear faithful,

The parallel between the early Christian era and today's world is not hard to establish when we realize that everything in our society tends to forget God and to persecute in many different ways those who wish to belong to Him. In the midst of calamities, scandals, persecutions, defection from the faith, one might fall into two opposite traps. Two dangerous reactions might drive the soul far from the practice of supernatural hope. First: **Presumption**: which consists in expecting from God Heaven and the graces necessary to reach it, without willing to take the means he has ordained, which source can be found in Pride and Vainglory. And discouragement or **despair**. Spiritual authors affirm that souls frequently tempted, and at times overcome in the struggle, tortured by scruples, lose heart; imagining they cannot reform, they come to despair of their salvation. But "Be grateful for trials and tribulations! When all is going well, we forget God; only in adversity do we seek Him for comfort."

It is our hope that, with a generous response from our faithful, Sacred Heart Retreat Center will open its doors after several months of renovations.
