

FROM OUR VICE-RECTOR, REV. CANON SEQUEIRA

Dear faithful,

Deriving profit from our faults is one of the most important topics in the spiritual life. It is quite certain that, in the designs of God, the faults into which He permits us to fall ought to serve for our sanctification, and that it depends on us to draw this advantage from them. Nevertheless, it happens, on the contrary, that our faults themselves do us less harm than does the bad use we make of them.

The faults that happen to us often give us occasion for great acts of virtue, which we certainly would not have had the opportunity of practicing without them; and God allows these faults with that intention. The fault was committed on the impulse of the moment, but the act of reparation is made with reflection, with an effort over ourselves, with a full and deliberate will. This is an act that pleases God much more than the fault displeased Him.

HOW TO PROPERLY RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION

Reception of Holy Communion In the Traditional Mass, Holy Communion is offered exclusively on the tongue by the priest. This is offered in a safe and "contactless" manner, but to ensure that this is done with ease the communicant must follow the following guidelines: - Stick out your tongue slightly while your head is titled back slightly. - Do not move your head while the priest is trying to give you Communion. - Wait for the host to be placed on your tongue and the priest's hand is away from your mouth before closing your mouth. - Do not say "Amen" before or after receiving our Lord as this may cause difficulty for the priest giving you Communion.

Rules & Reminders from the Rector

Dear Faithful,

As we continue to grow in numbers, it is necessary that I remind you all of the following important rules regarding the Social Hall and Church:

- It is strictly forbidden to place cards, announcements, posters, booklets, devotions, brochures, etc. for public display/offering without the explicit permission of the Rector. This permission is never to be presumed.
- Access to the choir loft is strictly forbidden to all non choir/schola members. Explicit permission from the Rector or Music Director must be given and is never presumed. We are asking the Ushers to be particularly vigilant in this matter moving forward.
