FROM OUR PASTOR, REV. CANON COMMINS

One might wonder; is my prayer always answered? There is a merit attached to the prayer of the just (in the state of grace), because of the bond that unite him to God, according to his divine adoption. From this point of view, our prayer is vivified by the spirit of adoption, which makes us cry out, *Abba, Father*. This is a merit that implies a certain value not equal to the reward, our salvation, ultimate reward, but proportionate to it, according to a divine will and promise without which there would be no strict right on our end. This promise is truthful, because given by God: Ask, and the gift will come; seek, and you shall find; knock, and the door shall be opened to you. Everyone that asks, will receive; that seeks, will find; that knocks, will have the door opened to him.



Yes, we cannot control all that happens during our day, <u>but please make a particular effort to be on time for Sunday Mass</u>.

BEARING IN CHURCH:

Dear Parents, children are the joy of our Saint Joseph Shrine family, and your reward is great in heaven for gen ously accepting this gift of Divine Providence. When you have a crying child, particularly during the Sermon or the Canon of the Mass, you are kindly asked to make use of the vestibule in the back of the church. You are also requested to keep them from running around or banging on the pews. Keep in mind as well, that when your child requests that you take him/her out of the church for a necessity of nature, apart from a true emergency, it is important not to do so during the Canon of the Mass, and especially not at the moment of the Consecration.

The vestibule in the back of the church functions as a crying room during the Mass. Please feel free to make use of it when you have a crying child, exiting quietly down one of the side aisles.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation, and, above all, for your presence here at Saint Joseph Shrine.
