Blessing of the Epiphany Water & Chalk

Wednesday, January 5 - Following the 6:00 p.m. Mass

The feast of the manifestation, or Epiphany, is traditionally celebrated on the 12th day after Christmas on January 6. This Feast is a great feast in memory of Jesus showing His glory in 3 ways: as an infant to the Magi, at His baptism, and at His first miracle at the wedding in Cana. It is a Holy Day of Obligation in many parts of the Catholic world, though not currently in the United States. It is traditional for parish priests to bless water on the eve or vigil of Epiphany which is then used for the blessing of homes the next day. It is also a common practice, depending on when the Epiphany falls in the calendar that the water and chalk are blessed on or around the day of the Epiphany. Chalk for each family is also blessed so that they may mark the names of the three Magi over their doors, as a witness of their faith and protection against evil. The blessing of water on the vigil of the Epiphany is performed with full solemnity before the main altar. It begins with the Litany of Saints, reading of Psalms 28, 46, and 146, the chanting of an Exorcism against Satan and the apostate angels, followed by various Canticles & the blessing of water with powerful and forceful prayers that purge the water of all evils and demons and that implore God's benediction for health of body and protection of soul. A hymn of praise; Te Deum, concludes the ceremony.

The exorcisms are unique to the Epiphany water and make it a powerful sacramental against attacks of Satan so that "wherever this water and salt is sprinkled it may turn aside every attack of the unclean spirit". The water is poured into the Holy Water tank and is used in the blessings of the homes during the Octave of the Epiphany.

The home is blessed on the Feast of the Epiphany or during the Octave by a priest or senior member of the household. The purpose of the blessing is to witness to the Faith and to beseech salvific benefits and protection from evil. If a priest is present, incense is used. Holy water is sprinkled throughout the home and, using blessed chalk, the lintel of each exterior-leading door is marked with the year and initials of the three kings, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The initials also form the first letters of the Latin prayer *Christus mansionem benedicat* [May God bless this house], and serve as a reminder of the date and purpose of the blessing.


After the Epiphany water and chalk are blessed, they will be available for families to take and bless their homes.

The Blessing of the Home prayers, instructions, Epiphany water and blessed chalk will be available in the side entrance on January 6. Please be mindful of the amount you take as we have many more families this year.



EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Epiphany is one of the oldest Christian feasts and one of the most important. Historically, Epiphany celebrated four things: Jesus' nativity, the Magi's visit to the Holy Family, Jesus' baptism, and Jesus' first miracle at the wedding feast of Cana. Each biblical event is a theophany, or epiphany, a special manifestation of Jesus Christ to mankind. The relationship between these events is beautifully described in this antiphon from the Divine Office: "This day is the Church joined unto the Heavenly Bridegroom, since Christ hath washed away her sins in Jordan; the wise men hasten with gifts to the marriage supper of the King; and they that sit at meat together make merry with water turned into wine. Alleluia." In the Latin Church the visit of the Three Kings is the primary focus of Epiphany, symbolizing the revelation of Jesus Christ as a light for the Gentile nations and the Savior born for the redemption of all mankind. Epiphany is January 6th, traditionally marking the end of the 12 days of Christmas.

Blessing of Children on the Feast of the Holy Family - January 9

The Confraternity of Christian Mothers - CCM of St. Patrick's Oratory has requested a special blessing for children be performed on the Feast of the Holy Family, January 9, after the 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. Masses, in response to Christ's command to "Suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not, for the kingdom of heaven is theirs, and their angels always see the face of my Father." Following Mass:

The children are to be assembled near the front of the church.

The priest begins the ceremony with antiphons and psalms. Several prayers follow that beg God's blessing on them to "let them constantly advance, desiring thee, loving thee, fearing thee, obeying thy commandments -- thus coming to their destined home, through thee, Savior of the world." Another prayer asks God's protection of children in every adversity and a special invocation directed towards the children's angel guardians.

We are privileged to have these special blessings and sacramentals available to us and therefore it is incumbent upon us to take full advantage of them in order to help protect ourselves and our loved ones in these wicked times.
