# DID YOU NOT AGREE WITH ME?

The parable of today is a profound lesson.

At first sight, it looks perplexing. If an employer did that today he may have trouble with a local union.

But this parable is not a lesson of social justice. The employer stands for God. We are the workers. The vineyard is the service of God. The day is our life. The steward is Jesus the judge, and the denarius coin is Divine Grace. It is the Divine generosity which is mirrored in the example of the employer.

The ways of God are unfathomable to us. Who are we to think that it is not fair? Should I not rejoice to see our good Lord showing mercy to the old sinner? When Jesus died on the Cross, the good thief obtained salvation at the last minute; he came at the eleventh hour. The surprising attitude of the employer is motivated by mercy and generosity for those who arrived later in the day. He shows compassion for them.

We remember that God owes us nothing. He says, "Am I not free to do as I please with my money? Or are you envious because I am generous? Am I not free to do as I please with my Grace?"

Our response should be gratitude for what we have received and joy for the good fortune of others. God does not deal with us with strict justice.

We thank Him for that. If He did, we would all be lost.



# Second Part of Ecclesiastical Year - Season of Septuagesima

With Septuagesima begins the Pre-Lenten season which comprises Septuagesima, Sexagesima and Quinquagesima Sundays. These three weeks form a transition from the joy of Christmastide to the austerity of the Penitential Season of Lent. This is the Season when the Church most earnestly invites her children to prepare properly for the Feast of Christ's glorious Resurrection. She urges them to rise from and expiate their sins; to practice prayer and charity with greater zeal; to become indeed new men through God's grace.

From Septuagesima to Holy Saturday, the "Alleluia" as well as the "Gloria in excelsis" are omitted in "Masses of the Season." Purple vestments are used to signify penance.

When viewed in the light of Adam's fall, the Mass celebrated today contains a solemn note of sorrow. God holds out a great reward to us, but we must work to receive it. Unfortunately, we are by nature more inclined to endure hardships for the perishable goods of this life then we are for the Kingdom of God and our eternal happiness in it.



# St. Valentine, Priest & Martyr Monday, February 14 - 6:30 a.m. Mass

St. Valentine of Rome (c. 270) was a priest who lived in Rome during the reign of Emperor Claudius II. Little is known of his life with certainty, except that he ministered to Christians who were persecuted and imprisoned for their faith, and died a martyr. One account has it that the emperor banned all marriages and engagements in Rome, believing this was the reason Roman men were unwilling to serve in the army. Valentine defied this unjust decree and continued to perform marriages for lovers in secret. He was arrested, and while in prison he restored sight to his jailer's blind daughter, causing the jailer and his entire extended household, forty-six people in total, to immediately convert to Christianity. Upon hearing this, Claudius ordered Valentine's execution. St. Valentine left a farewell note for the jailer's daughter, whom he had befriended, and signed it "From Your Valentine." He was beheaded on February 14th. St. Valentine is the patron of many causes including bee keepers, betrothed and engaged couples, lovers, love, happy marriages, and young people. His feast day is February 14th.
