The Preparations We Need to Make To Enter into the Lord's Passion



Why does the Church have us ponder this passage where Christ asserts His Divinity on Passion Sunday? Not only because it reveals the opposition to Jesus that would lead to His death, but also it is meant to expose within us any resistance to living by faith in Jesus.

Do we oppose Him in any way? Do we recognize that Jesus is telling the truth and therefore believe in Him with all our heart, mind, soul and strength? Do we listen to the words He says and obey them just like Jesus who knows the Father and keeps His word? Do we honor Jesus or dishonor Him by our thoughts, our words and our conduct? Do we rejoice to see Jesus' day? Do we believe that for those who keep His word death is nothing other than a change of address, to a place far more beautiful than any earthly temple?

As we draw closer to the reliving of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection, the Church wants us pondering these thoughts and making choices. Choices about how we're going to spend these next two weeks. Choices about whether we're going to receive the atoning fruits of His Passion in Confession. Choices about whether we're going to persevere in and up our prayer, fasting, almsgiving, or whether we're going to allow our commitments to wane. Choices about whether we'll be satisfied with being part-time in our spiritual life or making our whole life an act of divine worship. Choices about wining with Christ or losing with our selfishness.

The Church now begins the two weeks of Passiontide.

All the holy images in the church are covered; the Gloria Patri is removed from most of the liturgy; the Judica Me is removed from the prayers at the foot of the altar and all external enticements to joy and consolation are silent.

Throughout the season of Lent, the Church has emphasized penance and conversion. Her sorrow was for sin; weeping was to expiate our infidelities. But the sorrow is more intense and has a different motive this week; She morns now the sufferings and death of her Spouse.

During the fourth week of Lent, we see a crescendo of hatred in Our Lord's enemies throughout the daily readings. Every miracle, every exhortation, every mercy of Our Lord is seized upon by His enemies as an occasion against Him. And with the resurrection of Lazarus, the Synagogue has resolved to put Him to death. The altercation between Christ and His enemies recounted by St. John today took place in Jerusalem, probably six months before the Passion. Christ said to the Jews, "Before Abraham was made, I am." The term "I am" was the mysterious and unutterable name of God in the Old Testament - "I am who am." The people rejected Christ's claim that He was God, and so they took up stones to stone him for blasphemy.

But what about us? We can and should be outraged at the treatment of Christ, but we are the ones who need to see how often we reject God, failing to hear the words of God ourselves. St. Bernard says the greatest proof of predestination is the profitable hearing of God's word. If we don't **do** the word of God, then we aren't hearing it profitable; instead we are fools, as St. James describes those who hear the word and keep it not.

The word of God tells us that we must root out pride, covetousness, lust, anger, gluttony, envy, and sloth. The word of God condemns gossip, backbiting, impurity, immodesty, and disrespect for elders. The word of God commands of us a life of sanctity, virtue, and sacrifice, in which we love God above all things and love our neighbors as ourselves for the love of God. During this Passiontide, let each one of us look in the mirror and see if we are really hearing the word of God. Let us not ignore the rebukes our consciences give us. That's the word of God in ourselves telling us what to do. Let us make the words of today's Offertory our own: "I will keep thy words."


St. Aloysius Teen Group Thursday, April 21
