Christ or Barabbas

Pilate, the time-serving politician, stepped forward on his sunlit portico. On his right stood Christ, the Just One, who came to give His life for the redemption of many. On his left stood Barabbas, the wicked one, who has incited a revolt and taken a life. Pilate asked the mob to choose between the two: "Whom do you want me to release to you, Barabbas or Jesus?" How would I have answered that question had I been in the courtyard that Good Friday morning? I cannot escape answering by saying that the question belongs



only to the past, for it is as actual now as ever. Our conscience is the tribunal of Pilate. Daily, hourly, and every minute of the day, Christ comes before that tribunal, as virtue, honesty, and purity. Barabbas comes as vice, dishonesty, and uncleanness.

As often as we choose to speak the uncharitable word, do the dishonest action, or consent to the evil thought, we say in so many words, "Release unto me Barabbas." And to choose Barabbas means to crucify Christ.

To choose Barabbas, to choose sin, means to crucify Christ, because He died for our sins. In order for us to have the chance to enter into heaven, He had to die for us. That's the reality. So, every day our conscience is the praetorium's courtyard and we're given the chance to choose between Jesus and Barabbas, between Jesus and Satan, between Jesus and our own will, between Jesus and sin. How have we been choosing? Do we realize that all that we just read in the Passion happened on account of our sins? And how great a love does Jesus have for us to have gone through all of that for us? Let's choose Jesus.

Holy Week Liturgy Announcement

For the benefit of the faithful, special booklets will be used during Holy week in all of the apostolates of the Institute of Christ the King.

They contain the older form of the Ritual and its prayers with English translations and explanations, offering a spirituality that is especially rich and edifying in total conformity with the spirit of the Roman Missal.



These booklets will be used on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil and are available at the entrance to the church. Please note booklets should remain in the church after each Mass.

Second Sunday in Passiontide Palm Sunday

Hosanna to the son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord!

Following the Jews' example on Palm Sunday, we proclaim Christ as Victor -- He is the Messias, the Son of David and the Son of God. He is the sign of contradiction, acclaimed by some and reviled by others, sent into this world to wrest us from sin and the power of Satan. He underwent His Passion, the punishment for our sins, but issues forth triumphant from the tomb, the victor over death, making our peace with God and taking us with Him into the kingdom of His Father in heaven.

The predominant theme of Palm Sunday is the account of our Lord's Passion. Christ's triumph was preceded by His humiliation "even to the death of the Cross." St. Paul lays particular emphasis on our Lord's voluntary humiliation which was the condition of His exaltation and our redemption. While His great example is a reminder of what we owe to His sufferings, it should also teach us that only if we are "instructed by His patience," and the other lessons of the Passion may we "share in His resurrection."

As of old on Sinai the blood of the victims sealed the covenant of God with His people, so on the cross the Blood of the perfect Victim, Jesus Christ, will seal the new covenant between God and man, as it was foretold by the prophets. St. Matthew's account of The Passion emphasizes the fulfillment of the Scriptures; the whole somber tragedy takes place according to the divine plan; the prophecies are fulfilled, Jesus is the promised Messias.


