PEACE BE TO YOU

Why did Thomas refuse to believe the testimony of the other ten Apostles, men whom he knew well, and whom he surely knew were not dishonest?

It is hard to be certain. Perhaps St Thomas was secretly a little hurt that the Lord had chosen to appear to the others and not to him. In any case, there was something in his heart that prevented him from making an act of faith in the Resurrection. This reminds us that faith is what we call a supernatural virtue: that is, it is not something that can be produced simply by will-power or by reasoning, however intelligent a person may be – it is always a gift of God, and like all the greatest gifts of God, faith is given not to the proud but to the humble.

Notice that St Thomas's disbelief was serious, since he was disbelieving not just the other Apostles, but ultimately, God Himself, who gave testimony through them.

Jesus responds to the unbelief of His Apostle with great wisdom.

Often, if someone disbelieves us, we are quick to justify ourselves, because we can't bear anyone to have a bad opinion of us. But Our Lord, who could certainly have appeared at any time to St Thomas, waits and allows a week to pass. Perhaps He allowed His Apostle to remain in unbelief for all this time so that St Thomas would in the end

recognize more readily that he had been guilty of sin in not listening to the testimony of his friends.

And after eight days, again His disciples were within, and Thomas with them. And Jesus came, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, "Peace be to you". May Jesus guard us all during this Paschal time and bring us to perfect union with Himself: My Lord and my God!



According to our liturgical tradition, and the norms in effect:

- Holy Communion is received on the tongue and (if possible for you) kneeling - Non-Catholics or non-practicing Catholics not in full communion with the Church are asked to abstain from receiving Holy Communion -



The month of April is traditionally dedicated to devotion to Jesus in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. The Catholic Church teaches that the Blessed Sacrament is the real and living presence of Christ—His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—received into our souls with every reception of Holy Communion. Our Eucharistic Lord is the source and summit of our Christian life, the ultimate proof of His infinite love for us.



St. Mark the Evangelist Monday, April 25 5:00 a.m. & 8:00 a.m. Mass

(1st c.) was born to Jewish parents living in Libya in North Africa, later settling in Cana of Galilee not far from Jerusalem. Mark became one of the 70 disciples of Jesus and

the author of the Gospel that bears his name. According to tradition, St. Peter the Apostle was married to a relative of St. Mark's father, and after Mark's father died, Peter looked after him like his own son. Being a close disciple of St. Peter, the first Bishop of Rome, Mark's Gospel is addressed to Gentile converts to the Christian faith living in Rome. Most of what we know about his life and missionary activity is recorded in the New Testament. He traveled to Egypt and founded the Church there, and was martyred c. 68 A.D. by being dragged through the streets of Alexandria until his body was torn to pieces. St. Mark is the patron of lawyers and prisoners. His feast day is April 25.

What is an "octave"?

And why have we celebrated one this week?

The Church knows that one day of rejoicing just isn't enough for such a liturgically important feast as The Resurrection of Our Lord.

Easter is the "Solemnity of Solemnities"—the holiest feast day of the year.

For her most important feast days, the Church assigns "octaves": eight days of rejoicing in which we celebrate each day as though it were the feast day itself.

The tradition of octaves goes back centuries, even to Old Testament where the custom of an Eight-day feast was common.

During the week after Easter and Pentecost, the newly baptized neophytes would continue to wear the white garments they received at their baptism, rejoicing for eight days in the joyful celebration of their new life in Christ. The Sunday after Easter is called "Dominica in Albis" to commemorate the laying aside of the white garments.

Octaves underwent many deletions over time; the octaves for Corpus Christie, the Chair of Unity, Epiphany, and others are no longer in the Church calendar. Today we keep three of them: Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost.

So, rejoice! As St. Paul would say: "Again, I say, rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4).

How long is the Easter season?

Much like Christmas, Easter is not a "one-day" feast.

We continue celebrating the Easter octave all through the week, but the season doesn't end there.

The season of Easter continues on for a full fifty days, up through the feast of Pentecost. Easter is the holiest feast in the liturgical calendar, and it only makes sense that the Church should celebrate not just a feast, not just an octave, but a whole season in honor of Our Lord's Resurrection.

Within these fifty days we celebrate some important feasts: St. Mark, Sts. Philip and James, the Feast of the Ascension, the Queenship of Mary and finally, Pentecost itself, the birthday of the Church!
