MAY CROWNING

TODAY - SUNDAY, MAY 22

The May crowning will take place at 9:15 a.m. followed by *(weather permitting)* an outdoor procession. Everyone is invited to participate.

Prior to the crowning ceremony, all young girls are invited to meet in the narthex by the stairs to receive a flower to present to Our Lady. The flowers will then be gathered into a bouquet and placed at the feet of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The ceremony for the crowning of our Lady of Fatima will begin with a procession into church to present the crown to our Lady. The crown will be blessed, placed on Our Lady's head and then incensed. The Ceremony concludes with the Consecration of the Institute to the Immaculate Conception, followed by the outdoor procession. Upon our return to St. Patrick's, everyone is invited to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at 10:00 a.m.

ROGATION DAYS

April 25 and the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before <u>Ascension Thursday</u> are known as "Rogation Days," with April 25 being the "Major Rogation," and the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before Ascension Thursday -- "Rogationtide" -- being the "Minor Rogation."

"Rogation" comes from the Latin "rogare," which means "to ask," and Rogation Days are days during which we seek to ask God's mercy, appease His anger, avert the chastisements He makes manifest through natural disasters, and ask for His blessings, particularly with regard to farming, gardening, and other agricultural pursuits. They are set aside to remind us



how radically dependent we are on God through His creation, and how prayer can help protect us from nature's often cruel ways. Hence, its mood is somber and beseeching; its liturgical color is purple.

All the Rogation Days consist of a procession followed by a Rogation Mass. The procession, which traditionally moved around the territorial borders of a country parish, includes the blessing of the fields and other natural features of the landscape during the recitation of the Litany of the Saints. Let us pray during this time and ask God to have mercy on us and on the whole world.

ASCENSION THURSDAY

Ascension of Our Blessed Lord into Heaven

THURSDAY, MAY 26 | MASS AT 8:00 A.M. AND 6:00 P.M. - HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION -

After Jesus' Resurrection from the dead, He continued to appear to His disciples for a period of 40 days. After this time, with His Apostles gathered around Him on the Mount of Olives, Jesus was taken up bodily into heaven, that He might grant us to be sharers of His own divinity as recorded in the Gospels. To comfort them in His physical absence, He promised to send them a Consoler and Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to be with them and to guide them into all truth until the end of the world. The Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord is celebrated on the 40th day after Easter Sunday, also called Ascension Thursday. It is a Holy Day of Obligation, and among the oldest and most solemn feasts on the liturgical calendar.
