INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING SOVEREIGN PRIEST

IT IS NOT ENOUGH TO BE ON THE GUEST LIST



This parable makes it seem as though the King is both arbitrary and cruel.

He commanded his servants to invite "everyone" to the feast and then he's picky about what they're wearing, so picky that he will punish in a brutal way someone probably who was poor, maybe even from the streets, who didn't have any good clothes?

It's essential to understand how banquets worked in the ancient world. When kings or leaders would invite everyone to a party, they,

knowing that most would be poor and not have proper vesture, would normally send out the royal tailors to make proper clothing for everyone who was invited or in some other way provide the fitting clothing.

With this history, it's not difficult to recognize why the king would have been so upset about seeing this improperly attired man: this man would have deliberately refused to wear the clothing that was required and that he had made available. The man had refused to take off his old clothing and put on the new.

The lesson is clear. It's not enough simply to be on the guest list or to show up. God wants us to show up properly vested for the kingdom and its banquet. He'll provide all we need to show up properly attired, but we need to cooperate with his vesting us in his virtues. We must do our part.

ST. MARGARET MARY ALACOQUE

Monday, October 17 - 6:30 a.m. Mass

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) was born in France to a virtuous and distinguished family. As a child she showed great devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and by the age of 9 was practicing severe penances. In her childhood she became sick with rheumatic fever and was confined to bed for four years. She made a vow to the Blessed Virgin to consecrate herself to the religious life, after which she was instantly healed. She often had visions of Jesus, which she thought was a normal experience in the spiritual life. When she turned 17 her mother insisted that she establish a place for herself in the world. Margaret imagined that her childhood vow was not binding, and persuaded herself that she could serve God while living at home and continuing her penances and charity to the poor. She then joined her brothers at dances and began considering marriage. One day, upon returning home from a carnival ball, Jesus appeared to her and reproached her for her infidelity, reminding her of her promise. Margaret then entered a Visitation convent at the age of 24. Jesus appeared to her frequently, and entrusted to her the mission of establishing devotion to his Sacred Heart during a time when religion in France had grown rigorous and cold. Because of her visions she was greatly persecuted by those around her, until her virtue under suffering won over her enemies. Her visions were determined genuine and officially recognized by the Catholic Church 75 years after her death. Her feast day is October 17.

This Saturday, October 22 - 9:00 a.m. Mass

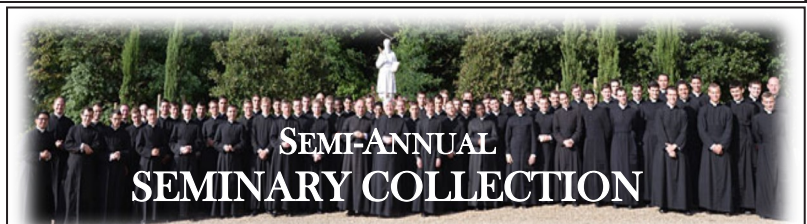
Perhaps no group of people has been so affected by difficulties in the last few years as the front-line workers in the medical profession. 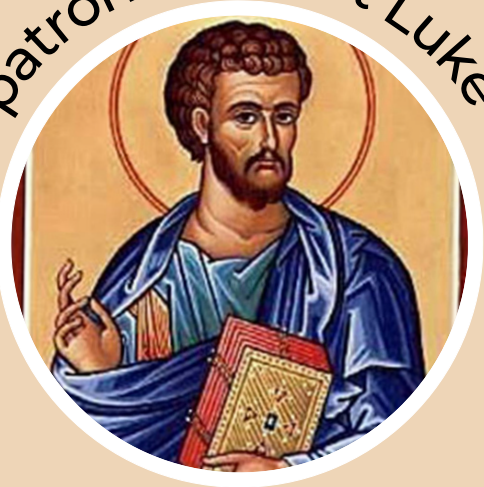
