We are all made to be transmitters of the teachings of Jesus Christ, for those who hear the words of Jesus are never mute. Christian muteness is a contradiction in terms; it is unthinkable!

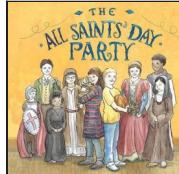


Grave Site Blessing
