Chair of Unity Octave

Oration for the removal of schism

January 18 - January 25

From January 18 (Feast of the Chair of St. Peter in Rome) to January 25 (the Conversion of St. Paul) are the Octave of Prayers for the Unity of the Church. This prayer is said once-a-day during this Octave.

Ant. That they all may be one, as Thou, Father, in me and I in Thee, that they also may be one in us; that the world may believe that Thou hast sent me.

V. I say to thee, that thou art Peter,

R. And upon this rock I will build my Church.

Let us pray:

Lord Jesus Christ, Who didst say to thine Apostles: peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you, look not upon my sins, but upon the faith of Thy Church; and vouchsafe unto her that peace and unity which is agreeable to Thy will: Who livest and reignest God forever and ever. Amen.



Intentions of the Octave

January 18th: The union of all Christians in the one true Faith and in the Church;

January 19th: The return of separated Eastern Christians to communion with the Holy See;

January 20th: The reconciliation of Anglicans with the Holy See;

January 21st: The reconciliation of European Protestants with the Holy See;

January 22nd: That American Christians become one in union with the Chair of Peter;

January 23rd: The restoration of lapsed Catholics to the sacramental life of the Church;

January 24th: That the Jewish people come into their inheritance in Jesus Christ;

January 25th: The missionary extension of Christ's kingdom throughout the world.

Saint Agnes, Virgin and Martyr

SATURDAY, JANUARY 21 9:00 A.M. MASS

St. Agnes (c. 291–304 A.D.) was born to a noble Roman family. She was a beautiful young woman of twelve or thirteen years of age when many suitors desired her hand in marriage. Instead of marrying, St. Agnes committed herself to a life of consecrated virginity as a spouse of Christ. She was then denounced to the authorities as a Christian during the persecutions of Roman Emperor Diocletian. She was condemned to be dragged naked through the streets into a brothel to be sexually abused. She miraculously escaped from this predicament with her virginity preserved, and was then condemned to be burned at the stake. Again, by a miracle, her persecutors were unable to carry out her sentence. Finally, they put her to death by

beheading. Of all the virgin martyrs, St. Agnes is held in the first place by the Church. She is one of the seven women, besides the Virgin Mary, commemorated by name in the Roman Canon of the Mass. St. Agnes' name means 'chaste' and she is the patroness of girls, chastity, engaged couples, virgins, rape victims, and the Girl Scouts. Her feast day is January 21st.
