

Saint Francis de Sales

The originality of Saint Francis de Sales is not found so much in his doctrine, but in his idea of the world. It is not for Christians to flee the world, but to live in it with God, and to live in it well. The Salesian Order invites reflection on the idea of vocation. Each of us has a vocation that is unique, personal, and beautiful. The Lord calls us to holiness so that each one of us can be fulfilled, but we do not all answer this call.

We have some very important gifts in life and these are given freely. Grace is here, and it sustains us, but it never replaces our own initiative. It is not as if the Lord follows our

decisions and endorses them. We often make decisions only after seeing results. Whether it is in our studies, our successes, failures, or major projects, is it not natural that in all this God leaves us the freedom to choose? We were created with a free will. The least we can do is refrain from contradicting the spirit of abandonment to the will of God, and instead restore the truth by our actions."

In life, we need to have both self-initiative and a sense of abandonment. Self-initiative and the spirit of abandonment are sort of like cats and dogs; when raised together, they get along wonderfully. For us, our education comes from a life of charity and union with God.

There are people of the world whose soul loves God and who wish to move ahead spiritually, and who do so generously and cheerfully. They are among the souls who love God and want to go to Him without tying knots in their brain. They go to God simply and freely.

The Feast of the Purification of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary

Thursday, February 2 | Holy Mass 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.



Thursday is the feast of the Purification of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary and the Presentation of the Child Jesus in the Temple forty days after His birth. It is also a feast of His Blessed Mother who submitted herself to the rite of purification of mothers after having given birth. She did this out of humility, though she knew that she was still a virgin.

This feast is also called Candlemas Day because on this day there is an ancient tradition, the blessing of candles as a sign of Christ as the light of the world, according to the prophecy of Old Simeon.

We contemplate the Presentation of the Child Jesus in the Temple every time we say the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary. This feast concludes the Christmas season with a joyous note: It is Jesus' childhood. But, it also has a sacrificial note because Jesus comes into the Temple to be offered to His Father as a victim for sin. The prophecy of Simeon celebrates the light that Jesus brings to the world. Light here means God's truth and the lighted candles today commemorate these words of the prophet. Because this light dwells in us, our mission is to be a shining light in the darkness of the world.

The liturgy invites us to meet Christ in the House of God where we will find Him in Holy Communion. At each Mass, we offer ourselves with Jesus to the Father, just as He did in the Temple. As Simeon held Jesus, Jesus was holding Simeon in His salvation just as He holds each one of us. The prophetic prayer of Simeon is appropriate to include in prayers after receiving Holy Communion; the Lord puts us at peace. Here at the altar, our eyes see His salvation, we receive Him and we are able to depart from the altar at peace.

the throat. The Church sanctions a special blessing of throats on his day, February 3. Throats will be blessed following the 6:00 p.m. Holy Mass on Friday, February 3 and again following all Holy Masses on Sunday, February 5.

Holding the blessed candles near the throat, in the form of a cross, the priest says:

"Through the merits and intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, God deliver thee from all diseases of the throat, and preserve thee from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and the Holy Spirit, Amen."
