So today is a day to reflect on that hope. It is the hope in the joyful Easter we will celebrate in just three weeks - the hope of resurrection.

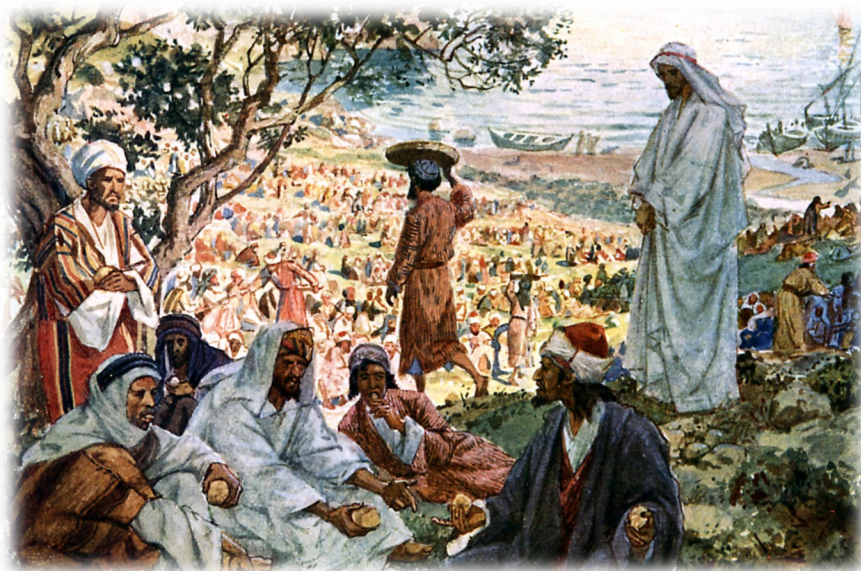

## SAINT JOSEPH

**Spouse of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary  
Patron of the Universal Church**

St. Joseph (1st c.) was a descendant of Israel's King David and a carpenter by trade. Scripture tells us that he was a just and virtuous man who was betrothed to wed the young Blessed Virgin Mary. Upon finding her expecting a child that was the Son of God, Joseph, after a time of uncertainty, was encouraged by an angel to continue with the espousal plans. Because of his complete faithfulness and obedience to the will of God, St. Joseph was chosen to become the spouse of the Mother of God and the adoptive father of Jesus Christ. As the divinely appointed earthly guardian and protector of the Holy Family, St. Joseph provided and cared for the material needs of Mary and the Child Jesus. St. Joseph is the patron saint of many causes, especially fathers, families, married couples, children, pregnant women, workers, craftsmen, against doubt, the dying, and a happy and holy death. He is also the guardian and protector of the Universal Church. He has two feast days: St. Joseph the Husband of Mary on March 19th, and St. Joseph the Worker on May 1st.

Glorious Saint Joseph, spouse of Mary, grant us thy paternal protection, we beseech thee by the Heart of Jesus Christ. 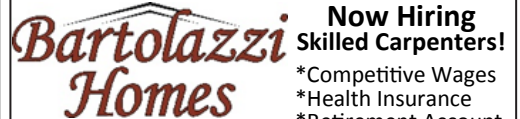
