PENTECOST SUNDAY

O COME, O HOLY GHOST

On Good Friday, the veil of the Holy of Holies had been ripped in two from the top to the bottom and the Divine Presence had FLED the Temple.

The numerous pilgrims present in Jerusalem on Pentecost day discovered a new model of Divine Presence: the Holy Ghost came upon them to make them understand the Apostles--each man in his own language! As they joined the newly founded Church, they would be introduced to the celebration of the Mass and the reception of God in a physical way they had NEVER before imagined to be possible.

They came to Jerusalem to celebrate the giving of the old law to Moses. On this day, they learned that Jesus had "Come not to abolish but to FULFILL the law." The externals of the law would no longer bind. Circumcision would no longer mark the body but rather BAPTISM would mark the soul.

A myriad of animal sacrifices would be replaced with Holy Mass, the renewal of this one sacrifice of the Cross, joining man to God in time and place. Not just in the Temple of Jerusalem, but everywhere in the world.

The Ten Commandments would still be kept, but now they would be kept out of LOVE FOR THE FATHER, rather than in the servile fear of a slave.

The Church speaks with tongues daily when the faithful witnesses speak of, with all their strength and faith, the wonderful truth of God. The miracles described in the Acts of the Apostles CONTINUE to be worked: the serpents are captured and overcome with your hands when you expel the wickedness of your heart, and out of your neighbor's heart as well, because of your benevolent influence. The forces of the evil one are defeated when you fight against temptations inviting you to mortal sin. The Church lays hands on our ailing humanity with the sacraments, and because of the works of mercy performed by her members, people RECOVER from illnesses.
