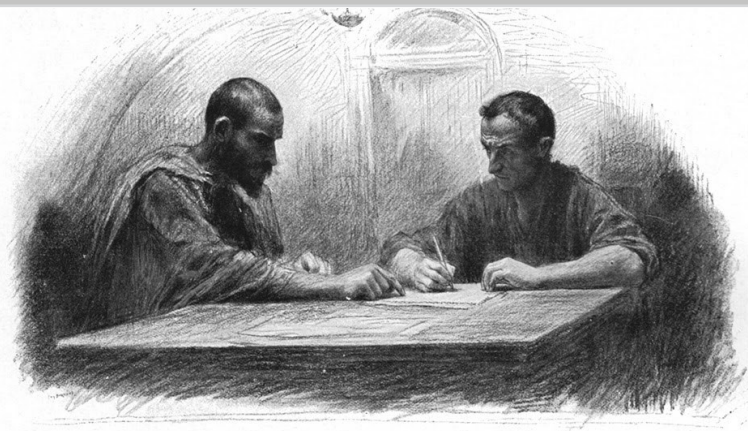

## St. Anne

*Mother of the Virgin, Grandmother of the Savior*  
**Wednesday, July 26 - 8:00 a.m. Mass**

St. Anne and St. Joachim (1st c. B.C.) are the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the maternal grandparents of Jesus. Their names have been preserved in Church tradition since the second century, although little is known of their lives. It is believed that St. Joachim and St. Anne, although wealthy, lived a devout and simple life of voluntary poverty, chastity, and generosity to the poor.



According to legend, after long years of suffering from infertility and praying for a child, Joachim and Anne were each separately visited by an angel in their old age, who announced that they would give birth to a very special child. Their moment of joy at this happy news is depicted with their embrace and kiss at the Golden Gate in Jerusalem. It was from their holy and chaste marriage that the Immaculate Conception was brought into the world.

According to tradition, when the Child Mary was three years old, they dedicated her to God and presented her to live in the Jerusalem temple until the time of her betrothal to St. Joseph. St. Anne is the patroness of unmarried women, wives, expectant mothers, pregnancy, women in labor, grandmothers, childless couples, and against poverty and sterility. Women praying to meet their future spouse often turn to St. Anne. St. Anne pray for us. Her feast day is July 26.

**SAINT JAMES**  
**THE GREATER**  
PRAY FOR US

**Tuesday, July 25 - 6:00 p.m. Mass**

St. James the Greater (died 44 AD) is the brother of St. John the Apostle, and was one of Jesus's original 12 Apostles. The title "Greater" was added to distinguish him from St. James the Lesser, and is believed not to concern status or holiness, but physical height. Besides being the son of Zebedee, what is known of St. James's life comes after he and his brother were called to leave their father and their nets and follow after Jesus. James was one of the three apostles invited to witness the miraculous Transfiguration of Christ on Mount Tabor. As well, his righteous anger at seeing a Samaritan town reject Jesus inspired him to ask Jesus to call down fire on the town, which Jesus gently rebuked. Following Christ's Resurrection and Ascension, James preached the Gospel across the Roman empire before traveling to Spain, where he spread the Gospel for many years. The famous "Camino de Santiago" pilgrimage path in Spain is named in his honor (Santiago is Spanish for James). At the end of his life, James returned to Jerusalem, where he was the first apostle to be martyred. His feast day is July 25th.

## SERVICE CONTINUED

### Scrip

This is an ongoing fundraiser that Oratory members can participate in by purchasing Scrip gift cards, which are sold on Sundays at the side entrance between the Masses. Gift cards are sold for many businesses for everyday purchases. St. Patrick's Oratory receives from 1-15 % back on all gift cards sold.

### Friends of St. Patrick's Oratory

This group is dedicated to building community and encouraging a spirit of family according to the Institute of Christ the King's mission. They help raise funds, guide social events, and other activities for the Oratory throughout the year.

## SOCIAL

### Confraternity of Christian Mothers

This group of mothers and grandmothers meet on the third Wednesday of the month at the 6 p.m. Mass, during which Canon Boucheron provides a sermon focused on the edification of the Christian mother. Mass is followed by 10 minutes of prayers for their families. Afterwards, a short social and/or meeting is in the rectory. Childcare may be available (please ask if you are unsure). Christian Mothers' prayers are also said after the first Saturday 9 a.m. Mass. New members can join at the annual Mass held on Sept. 15, the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, the primary patroness of the Confraternity.

### St. Joseph Men's Group

This group of men meet several evenings during the year. It is open to Oratory members over 21 years old. There is a spiritual talk from Canon Boucheron, followed by social time or activity.

### St. Theresa Women's Group

This group of adult women ages 18 and above provides opportunities for spiritual group through informative talks and discussion led by Canon and provides social time to foster friendships. The St. Therese Women's Group meets on a varying schedule throughout the year on Monday evenings 6-8 p.m.

### Married Couples Group

This group is geared towards married couples coming together to discuss the many challenges families face in today's society. Meetings are held once a month and the topics is led by Canon Boucheron.

### St. Jerome Book Club

From Sept. to June, a group of men and women meet once a month (date and time to be announced) beginning with prayer and then discuss a spiritual book being read, under the direction of Canon Boucheron.

### Sursum Corda

This group of young adults (ages 18-35) meet on First Fridays for 6 p.m. Mass and Benediction followed by social time. Other events are also scheduled throughout the year.

### St. Aloysius Teen Group

This group of teens (ages 13-17) meet most 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursdays (Sept.-June) for a spiritual talk followed by social time. It is geared as a way for teens to grown in their faith and build strong friendships.

### Company of the Immaculate

This group of young ladies (ages 5-18) meet on First Saturdays for 9 a.m. Mass, every other month. Afterwards, they participate in a variety of fun activities such as crafting, field trips, baking, and sewing dresses for the African missions. They also participate in corporal works of mercy such as collecting baby food for the A & A Alexandrina Center.

### St. Michael's Patrol

This group of young men (ages 5-17) meet on First Saturdays for 9 a.m. Mass, every other month. Afterwards, they participate in fun and educational activities that foster positive relationships. Previous activities include woodworking projects, visiting museums, the zoo, and playing at the park.

### Troupe of St. George

This is a group for fathers and their sons to strengthen their faith as a troop, while developing an appreciation for the outdoors. Other objectives include learning life skills and growing in manliness, patriotism, and physical ability.

## SPIRITUAL

### Altar Servers

Young men at least six years old can be trained to serve in various positions needed to celebrate Low or High Mass. Their service and participation adds to the dignity of the Traditional Latin Mass. For more information, please contact Canon Boucheron.

### St. Patrick's Choir

This choir is composed of men and women ages 15+ (exceptions apply), and typically sing for weekday evening High Masses and some Sunday High Masses. Rehearsals are held on Tuesdays, 6-7 p.m.

### Mens' Schola

This choir is composed of men ages 15+ and typically sing for 1-2 High Masses per month. Rehearsals are held on Tuesdays 7-8 p.m.

### Womens' Schola

This choir is composed of women ages 15+ and typically sing for one High Mass per month. Rehearsals are held bi-weekly on Tuesdays, 5-6 p.m. and 1<sup>st</sup> Saturdays, 10-11:30 a.m. Prior experience to singing chant is not required. The willingness and ability to work at home on your own during off weeks is very important and highly recommended.

### St. Patrick's Youth Choir

This choir is open to children ages 10-16. Children learn Gregorian Chant skills, hymnody and beginning polyphony. This group prepares our youth to sing in the St. Patrick's Mens' Schola, Womens' Schola and the larger St. Patrick's Choir.

### Organists

Organists enhance the beauty of the Traditional Latin Mass. They play for special Low Masses and/or with the various choirs for High Masses.

### Society of the Sacred Heart

This is a lay association within the Institute of Christ the King where Oratory members participate in the spirituality of the apostolic work of the Institute. Retreats are generally held once or twice per year. For more information, please contact Canon Boucheron.

### St. Philip Neri Society

This organization gives Oratory members the opportunity to spiritually "adopt" a Seminarian of the Institute of Christ the King by praying daily for him throughout his years of formation as a Seminarian

### Catechism

This program runs during the normal school year, for students ages 6-18. There are five different age categories for the classes which are taught by Canon Boucheron and lay people (all teachers have been certified through the Diocese's "VIRTUS" program). A Confirmation class is added, when needed.

### St. Monica Circle

This group of Oratory members invited by the Confraternity of Christian Mothers, pledge to pray for vocations by offering one weekday Mass per week for one year for the intentions of vocations at the Oratory. Two additional prayers are also said.

### Rosary Leaders

This group of people leads the Rosary on Sundays and weekdays 30 minutes before Masses.

### Fatima Prayers

Based from the World Apostolate of Fatima, this group meets on Mondays after the 6:30 a.m. Mass to say a rosary and Fatima prayers.

### Pilgrim Virgin Statue

Oratory members can sign up to have the Pilgrim Virgin Statue at their home for one week during the year. Special prayers are said in addition to personal prayers.

### Legion of Mary

This group is a worldwide lay apostolate of men and women devoted to implementing the spiritual works of mercy. Active members commit to attend the weekly meeting held on Sunday at 9 a.m. (between Sunday Masses) and perform a substantial active Legionary work each week. These include nursing home visits, teaching catechism classes, etc. In addition, there is an auxiliary branch of supporting prayer warriors who are not required to attend the meetings.

### 40 Days for Life

Oratory members are encouraged to walk and pray peacefully on Oneida Street (by the Planned Parenthood office) to end abortions on Saturday mornings from 10 a.m.-11 a.m. The men of the Oratory are also encouraged to join the "Sleep No More" shifts on Fridays from 8:00 p.m.-Midnight. This event is in Spring & Fall.

## SERVICE

### Altar Linens & Servers garments

Help keep the altar linens, vestments, and servers cassocks and surplices, cleaned, repaired, and pressed. By their beauty and form, altar linens add to the dignity of the altar, in the same way vestments solemnly ornament the priests and servers and their functions.

### Votive Candles

Help keep the votive candles supplied and replaced each week, which are available at the Oratory for prayer intentions.

### Funerals

Help with funerals by joining the Requiem Mass choir, leading the Rosary 30 min. before a funeral Mass, or preparing and serving a meal when needed.

### Flowers/Decorating

Help is needed to decorate the church beautifully for the Christmas season.

### St. Gerard Committee

This committee within the Confraternity of Christian Mothers supports mothers with meals due to the birth of a child or any other family need.

### Ushers

This group of men is responsible for greeting Oratory members, welcoming visitors by explaining the Traditional Latin Mass, taking collections during Mass, and performing other duties that need attention.

### St. Martha Cleaning Group

Help keep the church and the outside grounds clean and tidy by participating in the cleaning on a Saturday a few times a year.
