Good Samaritan

In today's Gospel, we hear a story that has become so universally known that its protagonist has become a sort of "household word," if not a cliché. Millions of people have some idea of what is meant by a "good Samaritan," even if they have never set foot in church.

"Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul and with thy whole strength, and with thy whole mind; and thy neighbor as thy self."

In our times? Well, that's not so clear. Surely most of us need to be reminded of our duties toward God. There is a lot of philanthropy in our world; a lot of money spent on the poor; but even with that, it is not always clear that it is really being spent for their well-being or for any other lasting purpose. So, being realistic, we need all three of the lessons contained in this parable.

If we are to gain eternal life we must be charitable to those in need, loving our neighbors as we love ourselves. We must be neighborly to people of good will, in spite of their differences from us, always keeping them in our prayers and giving them our good example. But most of all we must love God with our whole heart, and whole soul, and whole strength, and with our whole mind. And, given this last, the first two come naturally as well.

Only the foolish would try to talk about the love of neighbor without first acknowledging the need for the love of God.

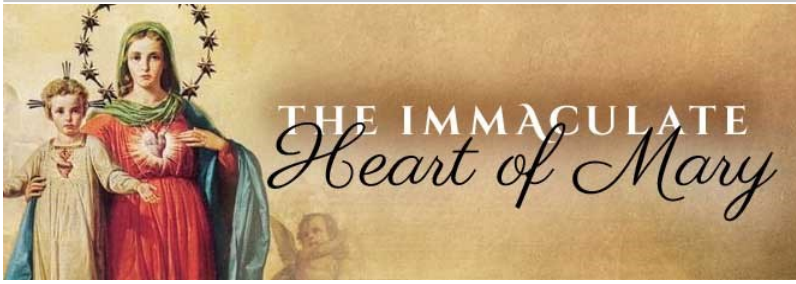

AUGUST - MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY



Tuesday, August 22

6:00 p.m. Mass

Historically, devotion to Mary Most Holy in the form of her Immaculate Heart first occurs in the thirteenth century with St. Mechtilde, St. Gertrude, St. Bernardine of Siena and others. In the seventeenth century, St. Francis de Sales was an exponent of this devotion. But it was St. John Eudes the great apostle of the Immaculate Heart (1601-1680), who gave the decisive impulse to the practice.

In the same century, the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus came to light through St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, and her confessor, St. Claude de La Colombiere. As the devotion to the Sacred Heart spread, so did the devotion to the Immaculate Heart. Both St. Margaret Mary and St. Claude, were deeply dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary as well.

Beginning with Pope Pius VI, several popes incrementally spread the devotion, but in 1944 Pope Pius XII extended it to the whole Church, fixing the celebration on August 22 and is still celebrated on this day according to the 1962 Roman Missal.

The Immaculate Heart of Mary Act of Consecration

O Immaculate Heart of Mary, Queen of heaven and earth and tender mother of men, in accordance with thy ardent wish made known at Fatima, I consecrate to thee myself, my brethren, my country and the whole human race. Reign over us and teach us how to make the Heart of Jesus reign and triumph in us and around us as It has reigned and triumphed in thee.

Reign over us, dearest Mother, that we may be thine in prosperity and in adversity, in joy and in sorrow, in health and in sickness, in life and in death. O most compassionate Heart of Mary, Queen of Virgins, watch over our minds and hearts and preserve them from the deluge of impurity which thou didst lament so sorrowfully at Fatima. We want to be pure like thee. We want to atone for the many sins committed against Jesus and thee. We want to call down upon our country and the whole world the peace of God in justice and charity.

Therefore, we promise now to imitate thy virtues by the practice of a Christian life without regard to human respect. We resolve to receive Holy Communion on the first Saturday of every month and to offer thee five decades of the Rosary each day together with our sacrifices of reparation and penance. Amen.

Dear Faithful,

I am very excited to announce a new group pilgrimage, taking place in 2024 with the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest. Our friends at St. Charles Catholic Pilgrimages have organized an extraordinary two-part exploration of France to be led by our own **Canon Benoît Jayr** of St. Stanislaus Oratory in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. All members of our Institute family are invited to take advantage of one or both pilgrimage opportunities.

In the first pilgrimage opportunity, from May 15–20, pilgrims will participate in the **historic Chartres Pentecost Pilgrimage**. This walking pilgrimage is the largest annual traditional Catholic event in the world today, drawing more than 16,000 participants from all across the globe. Pilgrims set out on a three-day trek (with two nights camping), walking from the Church of Saint-Sulpice in Paris to Notre-Dame in Chartres.

In the second pilgrimage, from May 20–31, pilgrims will embark on a **12-day, faith-inspiring tour of the major shrines of France**, beginning in Vers sur Launette near Paris with Holy Mass in the private chapel of the Institute's Sister Adorers of the Royal Heart of Jesus and concluding with a celebration dinner at Canon Jayr's family farm near Montauban in southwestern France. Highlights include:

- Daily Latin Mass with Canon Jayr
- Special visit to Le Barroux Abbey for sung High Mass
- Opportunities to pray in the presence of incorrupt saints such as St. Catherine Labouré, St. Vincent de Paul, St. Bernadette, and St. John Vianney
- A full day in Lourdes with a visit to the miraculous baths
- Visit to the tomb of St. Martin of Tours
- Visit to the Holy Face Oratory in Tours
- Mass at the Institute chapel in Toulouse
- Visit to Carcassonne Castle with time for shopping
- Visit to the tomb of St. Thomas Aquinas
- Dinner in Avignon, served with local wine
- Visit and dinner at the family farm of Canon Jayr
