The Sadness of the Disciples.

Jesus begins with a rhetorical question that makes evident the sadness of the disciples, evident in their hearts because of the approaching detachment from Jesus: "Now I am going to the One who sent me; not one of you asks, where are you going?"

It is clear that for the disciples the detachment from the life-style lived with Jesus implies suffering. And Jesus urges them saying: "Yet you are sad at heart because I have told you

this." Thus Saint Augustine explains such a sentiment of abandonment of the disciples: "they were afraid to think of losing the visible presence of Christ... they were grieved, saddened in their human affection, at the thought that their eyes would no longer be consoled in seeing him."

Jesus tries to dispel this sadness, due to the fact that they will not have His presence, revealing to them His departure. We can say that if He does not leave them, the Paraclete will not be able to join them; if He dies and therefore, returns to the Father, He will be able to send the Paraclete to the disciples.

His departure and the detachment from the disciples is the condition for the coming of the Paraclete: "because unless I go, the Paraclete will not come to you..."



MAY CROWNING & PROCESSION Sunday, May 12


