## What does "bearing the Cross" mean?

If we wish to walk behind Christ we have to bear His Cross. But what does that mean?

It is not only accepting the difficulties of life. It is above all bearing the salvation of the world, the load of all souls, the fight between Heaven and hell, sin and grace. To bear one's cross is to co-operate in the salvation of souls. The third means is to renounce, that is, not to cling to, what is temporary. The goods to

which we are so much attached are only material.



We need detachment *for* Christ. This is the work of the disciple. He follows Christ to the end. *He who wants to become a disciple must accept all the conditions of it.* He must embrace the wood of the Cross as the only comfort. Following Christ up to the end does not mean promising to be perfect at once; it means to become another Christ, offered up for the salvation of the world.

Such a gift is irreversible. Remember the meditations during Holy Week: Jesus Himself did not detach Himself from the Cross when the soldiers invited Him to do so. He carried on the work to the end.

The way to follow along this Eastertide is in His steps and makes us discover that the Resurrection first requests a certain type of death. Accepting a truth which is greater than us means humbly lowering ourselves. The coming feast of the Ascension invites us to prefer eternal life to earthly life.

### **ASCENSION THURSDAY**

Ascension of Our Blessed Lord into Heaven THURSDAY, MAY 9 | MASS AT 9:00 A.M. AND 6:00 P.M. - HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION -

After Jesus' Resurrection from the dead, He continued to appear to His disciples for a period of 40 days. After this time, with His Apostles gathered around Him on the Mount of Olives, Jesus was taken up bodily into heaven, that He might grant us to be sharers of His own divinity as recorded in the Gospels. To comfort them in His physical absence, He promised to send them a Consoler and Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to be with them and to guide them into all truth until the end of the world. The Solemnity of the Ascension of Our Lord is celebrated on the 40th day after Easter Sunday, also called Ascension Thursday. It is a Holy Day of Obligation, and among the oldest and most solemn feasts on the liturgical calendar.

### **MAY CROWNING & PROCESSION**

### Sunday, May 12

The May crowning will take place at 9:15 am and Immediately following (weather permitting) we will have a Rosary Procession around the St. Patrick's church neighborhood.

At 9:10 a.m. the girls age 5 and older who will carry baskets of flower petals should meet in the vestibule where someone will hand them their baskets and give them instructions.

May Crowning song sheets will be available in the rear of the church for use during the procession.

Our crowned Lady will be carried throughout the entire procession



The Procession is led by the Altar Servers with the processional Crucifix, followed by the girls with baskets of flower petals to scatter along the way. Next in the procession will be the men carrying the statue of Our Blessed Mother.

The Ceremony concludes with the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Wishing you the blessings and protection of the Queen of Heaven and of the Most Holy Rosary.

### **ROGATION DAYS**

The Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before <u>Ascension Thursday</u> are known as "Rogation Days," with Monday being the "Major Rogation," and the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before Ascension Thursday -- "Rogationtide" -- being the "Minor Rogation."

"Rogation" comes from the Latin "rogare," which means "to ask," and Rogation Days are days during which we seek to ask God's mercy, appease His anger, avert the chastisements He makes manifest through natural disasters, and ask for His blessings, particularly with regard to farming, gardening, and other agricultural pursuits. They are set aside to remind us how radically dependent we are on God through His creation, and how prayer can help protect us from nature's often cruel ways. Hence, its mood is somber and beseeching; its liturgical color is purple.

All the Rogation Days consist of a procession followed by a Rogation Mass. The procession, which traditionally moved around the territorial borders of the parish, includes the blessing of the fields and other natural features of the landscape during the recitation of the Litany of the Saints. Let us pray during this time and ask God to have mercy on us and on the whole world.

### The St. Monica Circle
