SACRAMENTAL BLESSINGS

I am often asked by the faithful to bless various items after Mass, however, this can become fastidious as I am often caught unawares, or end up giving the same blessing (which for certain sacramentals is extremely lengthy) multiple times on the same day, for different parties. In order to alleviate the situation, effective Sunday, February 5th, blessings of sacramentals will only be given on the Second Sunday of each month, immediately following holy Mass. This is the current practice in many of our other apostolates throughout the country, and has proven to work well. Thank you for your understanding.
