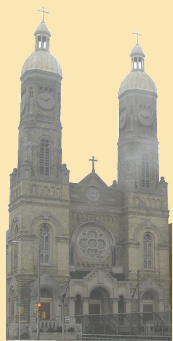
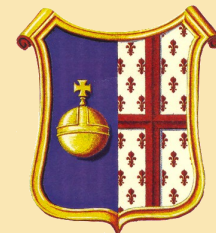

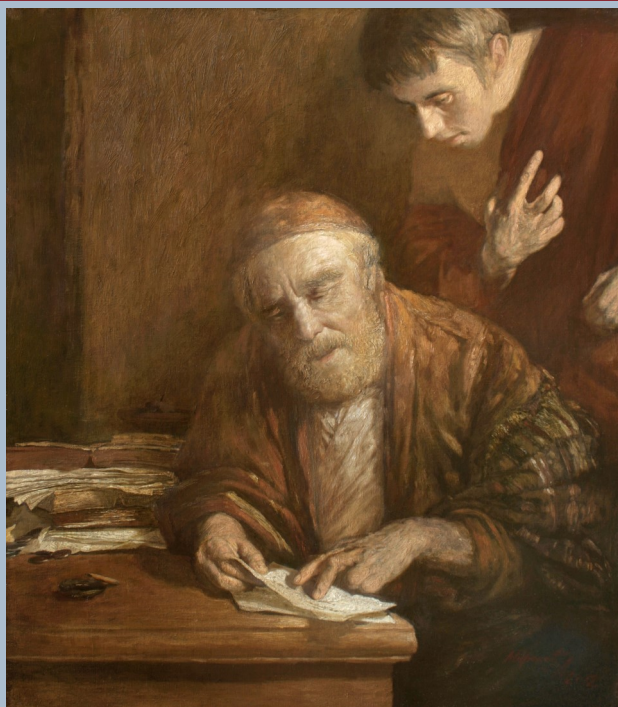

## **St. Kunegunda**

Monday, July 24th is the feast of St. Kunegunda. She is represented in our church by the right statue on the side altar, on the Gospel side of the sanctuary.

St. Kunegunda is from the 13th century and was the daughter of King Bela IV and niece of St. Elizabeth of Hungary. She married King Boleslaus V of Poland at age 16. Upon his death, she became a Poor Clare at Sandeck, Poland, in the convent which she had founded.

St. Kunegunda built churches and hospitals and served the poor and sick. She is also known at St. Kinga and St. Helen of Poland. She is the patron saint of salt miners.

## **MASS VESTMENTS**

At the time of the early Church, the same items of apparel worn now at the altar by the priest were part of ordinary clothing. Over the centuries, fashions changed but the vestments did not. This is symbolic of the continuity of the Church.

The first item the priest puts on is the AMICE. This is a rectangular piece of white linen with tie straps. It is a symbol of the helmet of salvation, as mentioned in 1 Thessalonians.

Originally, the priest kept in on his head to protect against the cold. Now, he may put it on head but slide it down around his neck. As a practical matter, the amice serves to protect the rest of his vestments from perspiration.
