SUNDAY, JULY 31, 2022 EIGHTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST (Mass Propers available in the Parish Bulletin)

Dear faithful,

On this **Eighth Sunday after Pentecost**, Our Lord has an at first curious lesson for us: "Make unto you friends of the mammon of iniquity" (Luke 16;1-9)! That is, imitate the prudence of the children of this world. Those who esteem this life as the only one and this world's paltry pleasures as pearls of great price often apply a greater diligence and more intelligence in their business and affairs than do the children of light in the business of working out their salvation. It's about time we gave these misguided individuals a lesson in prudence! Prudence is, after all, a virtue: it has as its first end the strengthening of our union with God, not success in temporal affairs here below, and certainly not just money-making based on our avarice.

Another <u>St. Michael's Patrol</u> has come and gone, and what a success! Any initiative such as a summer camp is, for a Catholic, first and foremost a spiritual apostolate, having as its primary end the fostering of virtue and the increase in the knowledge of the Faith, in particular the lives of the saints. Our focus this year was thus on **the lives of four holy Jesuit martyrs from the 17**th **century**: Saints Isaac Jogues, René Goupil, Jean de Brebeuf and Gabriel Lalemant, natives of France who came to the new world for one reason alone: the salvation of souls, particularly those of the Huron and Iroquois Indian tribes.

Each team of campers was assigned one of these saintly martyrs as their patron, and made flags bearing witness to their saint's patronage. Taking place in the beautiful hills of Saratoga, we enjoyed three days in the midst of God's creation, exercising our bodies in the many sports and games, developing our confidence before others by participation in campfire skits, feeding our love for the saints and their virtues by listening to conferences about their lives, and sanctifying our souls and minds by prayer, particularly the Holy Mass and the Rosary.
