EXTERNAL SOLEMNITY
OUR LADY OF THE MOST HOLY ROSARY

Dear faithful,

Each year at the beginning of the month of October, Holy Mother Church turns her gaze in an intensified way to the Mother of God, Mary, and to the prayer justly referred to as "Our Lady's psalter;" the Holy Rosary. How many times will these venerable beads pass through our fingers in this life? Indeed if we are fortunate and keep always deep in our hearts an ardent love for this good mother and her most cherished prayer, we will one day be able to look back on the course of our entire life and see it as one uninterrupted chain of these holy decades; our prayers rising up to God and always presented lovingly to him through the hands of Mary. In his 1891 encyclical *Octobri Mense*, Pope Leo XIII reminds us of the necessary place that Mary holds in obtaining for us the graces needed for our salvation:

"With equal truth may it be also affirmed that, by the will of God, Mary is the intermediary through whom is distributed unto us this immense treasure of mercies gathered by God, for mercy and truth were created by Jesus Christ. Thus as no man goeth to the Father but by the Son, so no man goeth to Christ but by His Mother."

It is most fitting therefore that we celebrate this Sunday the External Solemnity of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, the date of which is October 7 in the liturgical calendar (this Friday). We began our Novena in preparation for this feast last Thursday.

Let us remember that the particular intention of this novena is the defeat of an <u>evil</u> <u>piece of proposed legislation; Proposition 1</u>. If passed, this constitutional amendment that would permanently expand and <u>vastly increase abortions in California</u>. What a travesty this proposition must be in the all-pure eyes of Our Blessed Mother. <u>Did you know?</u> <u>The Holy Guardian Angels:</u>

October 2 is the Feast of the Holy Guardian Angels. Do you remember to pray every day to your own? After Our Lord and the Blessed Virgin, he's the best friend you've got here below, and takes pains to bring you safely to a blessed eternity. The Catholic Encyclopedia traces the evidence for these heavenly helpers through both the Old and New Testaments:

"At a much later period we have the story of Tobias, which might serve for a commentary on the words of Psalm 90:11: 'For he hath given his angels charge over thee; to keep thee in all thy ways' (Psalm 33:8 and 34:5).

...But in the New Testament the doctrine is stated with greater precision. Angels are everywhere the intermediaries between God and man; and Christ set a seal upon the Old Testament teaching: 'See that you despise not one of these little ones: for I say to you, that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father who is in heaven' (Matthew 18:10)."
