SUNDAY, DECEMBER 11, 2022 3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT ("GAUDETE")

Dear faithful.

On this Third Sunday of Advent ("Gaudete Sunday", after the opening words of the Introit of the Mass), Dom Prosper Guéranger reminds us of the true source of our joy: the redemption which Christ won for us by coming into this world and dying on the Cross. This is expressed in the symbolism of the Sacred Liturgy:

"...she feels that He is nearer than before, and therefore she thinks it just to lessen somewhat the austerity of this penitential season by the innocent cheerfulness of her sacred rites...the organ is played at the Mass; the vestments are rose color; the deacon resumes the dalmatic, and the subdeacon the tunic; and in cathedral churches the bishop assists with the precious mitre.

How touching are all these usages, and how admirable this condescension of the Church, wherewith she so beautifully blends together the unalterable strictness of the dogmas of faith and the graceful poetry of the formulæ of her liturgy!" (The Liturgical Year)

Hopefully we will always find reason to rejoice when present before the worship of Holy Mother Church. It is true that fatigue and the trials of life can weigh us down. When at Mass however, if we can remember that we are witnessing a foretaste of the Heavenly liturgy, and that we are surrounded by millions of invisible angels, perhaps our attention, our comportment and our gratitude to God will be brought to a more heightened state.

<u>Did You Know?</u> The use of greenery in Christmas decorations:

Thinking about decorating your home to warmly welcome Our Savior, who is coming? The *Catholic Encyclopedia* (1907) informs us that this beloved Advent tradition is indeed of ancient origin, and even has miracles associated with it:

"Gervase of Tilbury (thirteen century) says that in England grain is exposed on Christmas night to gain fertility from the dew which falls in response to 'Rorate Cæli' ('Drop down dew, ye heavens...'); the tradition that trees and flowers blossomed on this night is first quoted from an Arab geographer of the tenth century, and extended to England. In a thirteenth-century French epic, candles are seen on the flowering tree. In England it was Joseph of Arimathea's rod which flowered at Glastonbury and elsewhere..."
