Dear faithful,

We celebrate this Sunday Our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem more than two thousand years ago, a moment of joy which would soon be turned into one of pain and humiliation. God willed that by the suffering and death of His perfect Son, we sinners would be redeemed. Palm Sunday has quite the storied history in the Catholic Church, as the *Catholic Encyclopedia* (1907) makes clear:

"The emperors used to distribute branches of palm and small presents among their nobles and domestics. The Latin liturgical books call it 'Dominica in Palmis', 'Dominica' or 'Dies Palmarum'. From the cry of the people during the procession the day has received the name 'Dominica Hosanna' or simply 'Hosanna (Ozanna)'. Because every great feast was in some way a remembrance of the resurrection of Christ and was in consequence called Pascha, we find the names "Pascha floridum", in "French Pâques fleuries", in Spanish "Pascua florida", and it was from this day of 1512 that our State of Florida received its name."

Hopefully, many of those who were responsible for the death of Our Lord were later touched by grace and converted. From the Cross, Christ implored His Father to forgive them, for they were ignorant of what they were doing. We who know better have even less of an excuse for our frequent sins than they did. What use do we make of the gifts of God's grace that we have received? Let us reflect on this question during Holy Week, now before us, and ask Our Lord to perfect the work of purification He has begun in us. We can especially cooperate with Him by our sincere fasting and penance in the days to come.

There will of course be the traditional <u>Blessing of Palms</u>, <u>Procession and High Mass today at 12:30</u>. There will not be a reception after the 12:30 Mass this Sunday or next Sunday, which is Easter. The ceremonies will be very long today, and next Sunday, Easter, is certainly a day to spend more time with one's family.

Please be sure to check the <u>full Holy Week schedule</u> in the bulletin, in Flocknote and on the Oakland Apostolate website. We hope to have as many of you in attendance as possible at these venerable ceremonies in honor of Our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection.

I hope you're eggs-cited about our upcoming <u>Easter Egg hunt!</u> I'll try not to make any more puns. The hunt, originally planned for Easter Sunday (April 9) is postponed until Low Sunday (April 16).

Please continue to pray for <u>Pope Francis</u>. As you have no doubt seen, the Holy Father was recently rushed to the hospital with respiratory difficulties. He has since been discharged.

<u>Unfortunately, confessions</u> cannot be guaranteed on Holy Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The preparations before the ceremonies of the Sacred Triduum are heavily involved, and require much more time, attention and effort than usual. Confessions therefore will be heard after Mass, if necessary, this <u>Tuesday and Wednesday</u>.

Did You Know? Palm Sunday Traditions:

The Catholic Encyclopedia (1907) sheds light on some of the many varied and centuries-old traditions associated with this day. Here are just a few:

"In some places in Germany and France it was customary to strew flowers and green boughs about the cross in the churchyard. After the Passion had been recited at Mass, blessed palms were brought and this cross (in consequence sometimes called the Palm cross) was wreathed and decked with them to symbolize Christ's victory. In Lower Bavaria boys went about the streets singing the "Pueri Hebræorum" and other carols, whence they received the name of Pueribuben ("Theologisch-praktische Quartalschrift", 1892, 81). Sometimes an uncovered crucifix, or the gospel-book, and often the Blessed Sacrament, was carried in recession. In many parts of England a large and beautiful tent was prepared in the churchyard. Two priests accompanied by lights brought the Blessed Sacrament in a beautiful cup or pyx hung in a shrine of open work to this tent."
