

INVESTITURE OF THE HOLY HABIT OF THE SISTER ADORERS OF THE ROYAL HEART OF JESUS CHRIST SOVEREIGN PRIEST





On October 12, 2022, Wednesday morning at the Covent of St. Thomas in Naples, Italy; 7 young woman after more than a year of discernment courageously and joyfully received the religious habit and veil. Grace Pekny, my daughter, was one of the seven young women. Grace grew up attending the Oratory of St. Francis de Sales. After turning 18, Grace entered the Sister Adorers of the Royal Heart of Jesus Christ Sovereign Priest. As a Postulant, she moved to Germany. With God's grace, many prayers, help from her spiritual director and superiors, she was invited to begin her Novitiate and receive the veil. On that beautiful morning, as the fathers greeted their daughters, dressed in white bridal gowns, the seven young women solemnly processed from the Cloister of the Covent into their church, enrobed in glorious decoration and stunning flower arrangements. Words cannot express my thoughts and emotions as I watched my husband and oldest daughter walk arm in arm into the church. Monsignor Michael Schmitz, Vicar General of the Institute, gave a sermon highlighting the important commitment that these 7 young women were making, one that will lead to their sanctification. The investiture ceremony then began with the invoking of the Holy Ghost. The future Novices knelt, made a declaration of intention, in which they state their desire to "please [God] and to do in all things according to His royal and divine Will". The veils were removed one by one, and each young woman approached Monsignor Marco Agostini, Pontifical Master of Ceremonies, and he cut a lock of their hair to represent detachment from the world. Next, they each received their habits, and they were incensed and blessed with holy water. Each woman had the white veil placed on their head and then left the sanctuary to don their holy habits. With much anticipation, the newly habited Novices processed back into the church. Grace knelt before the altar where she was given her new name, Sr. Agnes-Marie of the Mother of Sorrows. Founder and Prior General, Monsignor Gilles Wach announced her name and then presented her with a candle as a representation of the spiritual light of Christ. Words cannot further describe this most moving day that touched my husband and I profoundly. We pray daily and fervently for a continuation of religious vocations. Sr. Agnes-Marie resides at the Maria Engleport Convent in Germany with her community of Sisters: her home and her life dedicated to God. Deo Gratias!


