SEPTUAGESIMA

Septuagesima is Latin for "seventieth." Seventy days before the Sunday of the Resurrection. The Septuagesima season is to help you ease into Quadragesima, the Great Fast, a type of preconditioning program. The Gloria and Alleluia are no longer allowed, the tone is very penitential with the priest wearing purple vestments. This is the Catholic version of Exodus 90, a popular penitential men's group.

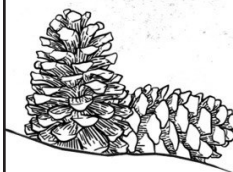

HOLY MATRIMONY:

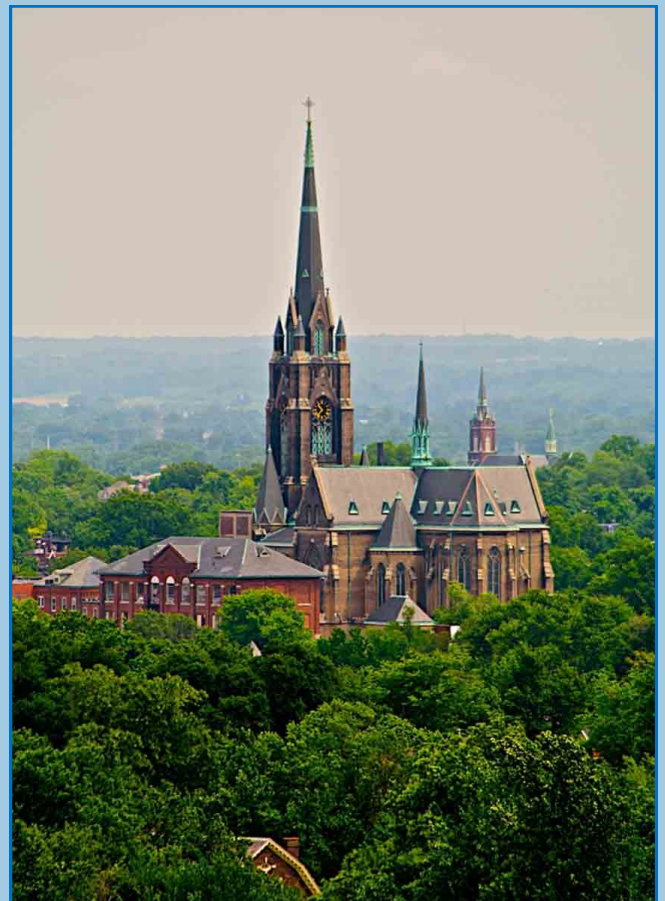
