

LET THE GREAT FAST BEGIN

During Lent we are called to fast, stripping ourselves of things that bind us to the earth and impede our better contemplation of spiritual things. Traditionally, the faithful practice fasting from certain foods during all of Lent, but there are other ways of fasting that can truly be penitential in 2023 society...penances permitting a clearing of our head that can enhance our focus on spiritual things.

Therefore, this year for those who are interested, the Rector proposes that as your Lenten penance, members of the faithful refrain from all internet usage except for 30 minutes each day during all of Lent. This includes all social media platforms, internet news/sports sites, blogs, streaming sites, gaming, video sites, texting and email. This suggestion is indeed challenging, but we must not forget that in the past our forefathers would have fasted from meat for the entirety of Lent. Thus, greatly cutting our internet usage for 40 days is in that same spirit.

Those interested in making an effort to complete this penance will enter their names into a register after the Masses at the Oratory from Feb. 19th to Feb. 21st. This name entry into our register constitutes formal participation in this particular penance. Each person entered is responsible for watching over his own adherence to the 30 minute rule. Should a participant fail in this effort on any given day, he should confess it as an imperfection to his confessor at his next confession in order to keep himself honest. Should a participant sense at any given point that this penance has become too burdensome, any priest may relieve him of his participation immediately.



As multiple contemporary sources can attest, our attachment to social media and internet applications is having numerous effects on society, the extent of which have yet to be determined. Though, they are pointing to a drastic increase in fewer truly human interactions, leading to all sorts of psychological difficulties, sadness, depression and anger. With this penance for Lent 2023, done for the honor and glory of God, may you rediscover the pleasure of reading hard print literature, calling your friends on the phone, visiting your family, handiworks, etc. Perhaps with the technological distractions out of the way you can better adhere to your resolutions of prayer, almsgiving and other works of charity proposed to us during the season of Lent.

This will be a considerable undertaking for those who decide to participate, so pray about it and do not enter into it rashly. It would be wise to discuss your participation with your confessor before committing. (N.B. The rector does not recommend this penance to people working remotely from home or people whose occupation has them on the internet most of the day.) There is no shame if you feel this beyond your grasp. However, just as it is easier to exercise regularly when we are in a group of committed individuals, it is the Rector's hope that a common group of penitents striving towards the same goal may help one another by their own example and prayers this Lent. The Easter Vigil Mass of 2023 will be celebrated expressly for the participants and their specific intentions.

THE TRADITIONAL FAST

The Great Fast begins this week. Quadragesima means 40, as there are forty days form Quadragesima Sunday until Good Friday, the first day to the Triduum. During these forty days we enter into the desert with Christ. Here is the 40 Day fast practiced in the Roman Rite and as described by St. Thomas Aquinas:

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday were "black fasts." These consisted of taking only one meal per day of bread, water, and herbs, after sunset.
- 2. Other days of Quadragesima: no food until 3pm, the hour of Our Lord's death. Water was allowed, and as was the case for the time due to sanitary concerns, watered-down beer and wine. After the advent of tea and coffee, these beverages were permitted.
- 3. No animal meats or fats.
- 4. No eggs.
- 5. No dairy products (lacticinia) that is, eggs, milk, cheese, cream, butter, etc.
- 6. Sundays are days of less liturgical discipline, but the fasting rules above remained.

The bare minimum that all Catholics are legally bound to follow is: Abstain from meet on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Quadragesima. Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, one meal and two small snacks. Pregnant mothers, elderly, children, and the sick are dispensed from fasting and abstaining.

Other things you should think about fasting from: all sweets, non-essential social media and internet use. Look across at the chart for more ideas.


