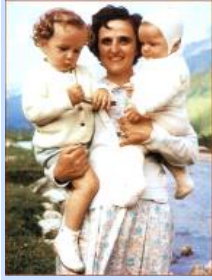

### Hymn for the Ascension of the Lord

When Thou, O Christ! earnest to Mount Olivet, there to fulfill the good pleasure of Thy Father, the Angels of heaven were in admiration, and the inhabitants of hell trembled. Thy Disciples, too, were there, and they thrilled with joy as Thou spokest unto them. A Cloud, like a throne, hovered above in front, awaiting Thee; the gates of heaven were opened, showing the beauty of its courts, and revealing its hidden treasures to the earth, that Adam might thus learn whence he had fallen and whither he was to re-ascend. Thy feet were suddenly lifted up, as though some hand were raising them. Thy words, as long as they were heard, were nought but blessing. The Cloud received Thee, and Heaven welcomed Thee within its bosom. It was for the salvation of our souls, that Thou, O Lord, didst achieve this great work, this work surpassing nature's law. Thou, O God, didst on this day raise up, together with Thyself, above all Principalities and Powers, the nature of Adam, which had fallen into the deep abyss, but which was restored by Thee. Because Thou lovedst it, Thou placedst it on Thine own throne; because Thou hadst pity on it, Thou unitedst it to Thyself: because Thou hadst thus united it, Thou didst suffer with it; because Thou, the Impassible, didst thus suffer, Thou gave it to share in Thy glory. The Angels cried out: "Who is this beautiful Man? nay, not Man only, but God and Man, having the Nature of both?" Other Angels, in white garments, hovered round the Disciples, and exclaimed: "Ye men of Galilee! this Jesus, this Man-God, Who hath left you, will return the God-Man, the Judge of the living and the dead, to give unto them that are faithful, pardon and abundant mercy."

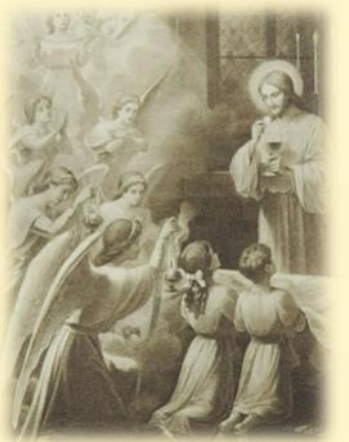
## Music Night!

## From the Rector's Desk:

Dear Faithful,

May 23-25, the three days before we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, please join in the **Minor Litany of the Saints** and prayers (found on pg. 5-6 of the online bulletin at [saintgianna.net](http://saintgianna.net)).

**The Novena in Honor of the Holy Ghost** is the oldest of all novenas since it was first made at the direction of Our Lord Himself when He sent His Apostles back to Jerusalem to await the coming of the Holy Ghost on the first Pentecost. **Addressed to the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, it is a powerful plea for the light and strength and love so sorely needed by every Christian.** The day following the commemoration of Our Divine Lord's Ascension into heaven, **May 14th**, we begin the **Novena and the hymn "Veni Creator Spiritus"** (found on pages 8-12 of the online bulletin at [saintgianna.net](http://saintgianna.net))

To encourage devotion to the Holy Spirit, the Church has enriched this novena with the following indulgences:

*"The faithful who devoutly assist at the public novena in honor of the Holy Spirit immediately preceding the Solemn Feast of Pentecost may gain a partial indulgence for themselves or as an offering for the intentions of the faithful departed.*

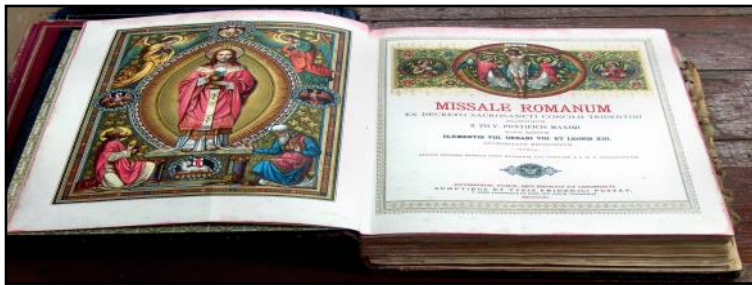

Like the Easter Vigil, this is a very beautiful liturgy when Catechumens would come into the church in commemoration of the preaching of St. Peter and the baptizing of 3000 souls (*Acts 2:41*). There are six Prophecies, the Blessing of Water, Baptisms and Confirmations, Litany of Saints and Holy Mass.



## **FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER EASTER**

**INTROIT:** *Is. 48: 20; Ps. 65: 1,2* Declare it with the voice of joy, and make this to be heard, alleluia: speak it out even to the ends of the earth: The Lord hath delivered His people, alleluia, alleluia. (Ps) Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: give glory to His praise. Glory be. Declare it with the voice...

**COLLECT :** O God, from Whom all good things do come, grant to us Thy suppliants, that by Thine inspiration we may think what is right, and under Thy guidance perform it. Through Our Lord.

**EPISTLE: Jas. 1: 22-27** Dearly beloved, be ye doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves. For if a man be a hearer of the word and not a doer, he shall be compared to a man beholding his own countenance in a glass: for he beheld himself and went his way, and presently forgot what manner of man he was. But he that hath looked into the perfect law of liberty and hath continued therein, not becoming a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work: this man shall be blessed in his deed. And if any man think himself to be religious, not bridling his tongue but deceiving his own heart, this man's religion is vain. Religion clean and undefiled before God and the Father is this: To visit the fatherless and widows in their tribulation, and keep one's self unspotted from this world.

**PASCHAL ALLELUIA:** Alleluia, alleluia. Christ is risen, and hath shone upon us, whom He redeemed with His Blood. Alleluia. I came forth from the Father, and am come into the world: again I leave the world and I go to the Father. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL: Jn. 16: 23-30** At that time Jesus said to His disciples: Amen, amen I say to you: If you ask the Father any thing in My name, He will give it you. Hitherto you have not asked any thing in My

name: Ask, and you shall receive, that your joy may be full. These things I have spoken to you in proverbs. The hour cometh when I will no more speak to you in proverbs, but will show you plainly of the Father. In that day you shall ask in My name: and I say not to you that I will ask the Father for you: for the Father Himself loveth you, because you have loved Me and have believed that I came out from God. I came forth from the Father and am come into the world; again I leave the world and I go to the Father. His disciples say to Him: Behold, now Thou speakest plainly and speakest no proverb. Now we know that Thou knowest all things and Thou needest not that any man should ask Thee: by this we believe that Thou camest forth from God.

**OFFERTORY: Ps. 65: 8,9,20** O bless the Lord our God, ye peoples, and make the voice of His praise to be heard: Who hath set my soul to live, and hath not suffered my feet to be moved. Blessed be the Lord, Who hath not turned away my prayer, nor His mercy from me, alleluia.

**SECRET:** Accept, O Lord, the prayers of Thy faithful, together with the gifts they offer: that by these rites of loving devotion we may enter into heavenly Glory. Through Our Lord.

**PREFACE FOR EASTERTIDE:** It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, at all times to praise Thee, O Lord, but more gloriously at this time above others when Christ our Pasch was sacrificed. For He is the true Lamb Who took away the sins of the world: Who by dying destroyed our death, and by rising again hath restored us to life. And therefore with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominations, and with all the hosts of the heavenly army, we sing a hymn to Thy glory, saying: Holy, Holy, Holy...

**COMMUNION: Ps. 95: 2** Sing unto the Lord, alleluia: sing unto the Lord, and bless His name; show forth His salvation from day to day, alleluia, alleluia.

**POSTCOMMUNION:** Grant to us, O Lord, who are filled with strength from this heavenly Table, that we may both desire what is right, and obtain what we desire. Through Our Lord.

This Jesus who is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come, as you have seen Him going into heaven.

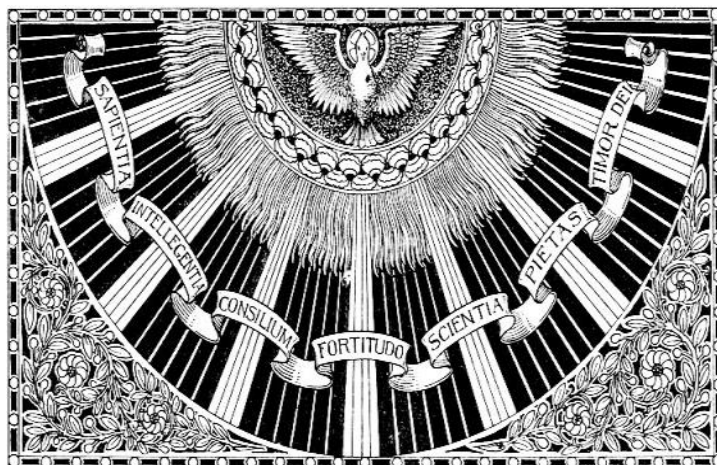
### ***The Fruits of the Holy Ghost***
