Feast of Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary (Oct. 7th)

In 622, Mohammed set out from Medina to conquer the Christian world for Allah by force and arms. In 100 years, they had taken from the Christians Jerusalem, Antioch, Alexandria, Hippo, Tunis, Carthage, Spain, and southern France. The Muslim expulsion from France was quick but Spain took 750 years to win back. For the most part, Europe was spared the rule of the Crescent. But following the fall of the Byzantine Empire in 1453, the Ottoman Turks were ready to make an attack on the mainland of Western Europe in hatred of the Christian Faith of the Crusaders. Pope St. Pius V called the Holy League to defend Christendom and called on monasteries, convents, and all the faithful to do penance and pray the Rosary for Mary's protection as a great naval battle was preparing at Lepanto. On October 7th, 1571, the Holy League stupendously defeated the Ottoman Turks and 15,000 Christian slaves were set free from the Ottoman galleys. Pope St. Pius V was granted a vision of the Christian victory and gave thanks to Mary. A special feast was instituted on this day in honor of Our Lady as the feast of "Our Lady of Victory" which would later become "Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary" as it was through the Rosary that the victory was obtained.

From the Introduction to the Apostolic Letter
ROSARIUM VIRGINIS MARIAE
OF THE SUPREME PONTIFF JOHN PAUL II
TO THE BISHOPS, CLERGY AND FAITHFUL
ON THE MOST HOLY ROSARY

1. The Rosary of the Virgin Mary, which gradually took form in the second millennium under the guidance of the Spirit of God, is a prayer loved by countless Saints and encouraged by the Magisterium. Simple yet profound, it still remains, at the dawn of this third millennium, a prayer of great significance, destined to bring forth a harvest of holiness. It blends easily into the spiritual journey of the Christian life, which, after two thousand years, has lost none of the freshness of its beginnings and feels drawn by the Spirit of God to "set out into the deep" (*duc in altum!*) in order once more to proclaim, and even cry out, before the world that Jesus Christ is Lord and Savior, "the way, and the truth and the life" (*Jn 14:6*), "the goal of human history and the point on which the desires of history and civilization turn".

2. The Rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer. In the sobriety of its elements, it has all the *depth of the Gospel message in its entirety*, of which it can be said to be a compendium. It is a beautiful echo of the most beautiful prayer of Mary, her perennial *Magnificat* for the work of the redemptive Incarnation which began in her virginal womb. With the Rosary, the Christian people *sits at the school of Mary* and is led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of His love. Through the Rosary the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer.

Solemnity of the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary

INTROIT: Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating a festival day in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on whose solemnity the Angels rejoice and give praise to the Son of God. *Ps. 44: 2* My heart hath

uttered a good word: I speak my works to the King. Glory be. Let us all rejoice...

COLLECTS: O God, Whose only-begotten Son by His life, death, and resurrection, purchased for us the rewards of eternal life: grant, we beseech Thee, that, meditating upon these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise. Through the same our Lord...

17th Sunday after Pentecost: Grant, we beseech You, O Lord, that Your people may avoid the temptations of the devil, and with pure minds follow You, the only God. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Prov. 8: 22-24, 32-35* The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning. I was set up from eternity and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived. Now therefore, ye children, hear me: Blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates, and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me, shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.

GRADUAL: *Ps. 44: 5, 11, 12* Because of truth, and meekness, and justice: and thy right hand shall conduct thee wonderfully. Harken, O daughter, and see, and incline thine ear, for the King hath greatly desired thy beauty.

ALLELUIA: Alleluia, alleluia. The solemn festival of the glorious Virgin Mary of the seed of Abraham, sprung from the tribe of Juda, of David's royal race. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Lk. 1: 26-38* At that time the Angel Gabriel was sent from God into a city of Galilee, called Nazareth, to a virgin, espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And the Angel being come in, said unto her: Hail, full of

grace: the Lord is with thee: blessed are thou among women. Who having heard, was troubled at his saying: and thought with herself what manner of salutation this should be. And the Angel said to her: Fear not, Mary, for thou hast found grace with God: behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and shalt bring forth a son, and thou shalt call His name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of David His father: and He shall reign in the house of Jacob for ever, and of His kingdom there shall be no end. And Mary said to the Angel: How shall this be done, because I know not man? And the Angel answering, said to her: The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee. And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. And behold thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath conceived a son in her old age: and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren: because no word shall be impossible with God. And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word.

OFFERTORY: *Ecclus. 24: 25; 39: 17* In me is all grace of the way and of the truth; in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Like a rose planted on the rivers I have borne fruit.

SECRETS: Enable us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to be fittingly prepared for offering these gifts, and through the mysteries of the most holy Rosary, so to meditate upon the life, Passion, and glory of Thine only-begotten Son, that we may be made worthy of His promises: Who with Thee liveth and reigneth.

17th Sunday after Pentecost: O Lord, we humbly pray Your Majesty that the holy rite which we are celebrating may free us from past and future sins. Through our Lord.

PREFACE OF OUR LADY: It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God: and that we should praise and bless, and proclaim Thee, in the Festivity of the Blessed Mary, ever-Virgin: Who also conceived Thine only-begotten Son by the overshadowing of the Holy Ghost, and the glory of her virginity still abiding, gave forth to the world the everlasting Light, Jesus Christ our Lord. Through whom the Angels praise Thy Majesty, the Dominations worship it, and the Powers stand in awe. The Heavens and the heavenly hosts together with the blessed Seraphim in triumphant chorus unite to celebrate it. Together with these we entreat Thee that Thou mayest

bid our voices also to be admitted while we say with lowly praise: Holy, Holy, Holy...

COMMUNION: *Ecclus. 39: 19* Send forth flowers as the lily, and yield a smell, and bring forth leaves in grace, and praise with canticles, and bless the Lord in His works.

POSTCOMMUNIONS: May we be helped, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by the prayers of Thy most holy Mother, whose Rosary we celebrate: that we may draw strength from the mysteries which we commemorate, and likewise obtain the fruit of the Sacraments which we have received: Who livest...

17th Sunday after Pentecost: By the workings of Your sanctifying power, almighty God, may our vices be cured and eternal remedies provided for us. Through our Lord.

GOSPEL of the 17th Sunday after Pentecost:

Mt. 22: 34-46

At that time, the Pharisees came to Jesus and one of them, a doctor of the Law, putting Him to the test, asked Him, Master, which is the great commandment in the Law? Jesus said to him, 'You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, and with your whole soul, and with your whole mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets. Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus questioned them, saying, What do you think of the Christ? Whose son is He? They said to Him, David's. He said to them, How then does David in the spirit call Him Lord, saying, The Lord said to my Lord: Sit at My right hand, till I make Your enemies Your footstool? If David, therefore, calls Him 'Lord,' how is He his son? And no one could answer Him a word; neither did anyone dare from that day forth to ask Him any more questions.

The Fifteen Promises of Mary Granted to Those Who Recite the Rosary

The Blessed Virgin Mary promised to Saint Dominic and to all who follow, that "Whatever you ask in the Rosary will be granted." She left for all Christians Fifteen Promises to those who recite the Holy Rosary. Imparted to Saint Dominic and Blessed Alan:

1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall receive signal graces.
2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell: It will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
4. The Rosary will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall not perish.
6. Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just he shall remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of eternal life.
7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
8. Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death the light of God and the plentitude of His graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the merits of the saints in paradise.
9. I shall deliver from Purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.
10. The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in Heaven.
11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the Rosary.
12. All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death.
14. All who recite the Rosary are my sons and daughters, and brothers and sisters of my only Son Jesus Christ.
15. Devotion to my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.

Feast of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face

INTROIT: *Cant. 4: 8-9* Come from Libanus, my spouse, come from Libanus, come; thou hast wounded my heart, my sister, my spouse, thou hast wounded my heart. *Ps. 112: 1* Praise the Lord, ye children: praise ye the name of the Lord. Glory be... Come ...

COLLECT: O Lord, Who hast said: Unless you become as little children you shall not enter into the Kingdom of heaven: grant unto us, beseech Thee, so to follow in humility and simplicity of heart the footsteps of Saint Therese, the Virgin, that we may obtain everlasting rewards: Who livest and reignest...

EPISTLE: *Is. 66: 12-14* Thus saith the Lord: Behold I will bring upon her as it were a river of peace, and as an overflowing torrent the glory of the Gentiles which you shall suck; you shall be carried at the breasts, and at the knees they shall caress you. As one whom his mother caresseth, so will I comfort you: and you shall be comforted in Jerusalem. You shall see and your heart shall rejoice, and your bones shall flourish like an herb, and the hand of the Lord shall be known to his servants.

GRADUAL: *Mt. 11: 25; Ps. 70: 5* I confess to Thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because Thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent and hast revealed them to little ones. My hope, O Lord, from my youth.

ALLELUIA: *Ecclus. 39: 17-19* Alleluia, alleluia. Bud forth as the rose planted by the brooks of waters: Give ye a sweet odor as frankincense. Send forth flowers as the lily, and yield a smell, and bring forth leaves in grace, and praise with canticles and bless the Lord in his works. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Mt. 18: 1-4* At that time, the disciples came to Jesus, saying: Who, thinkest Thou, is the greater in the kingdom of heaven? and Jesus calling unto Him a little child, set him in the midst of them and said: Amen I say to you, unless you be

converted and become as little children, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, he is the greater in the kingdom of heaven.

OFFERTORY: *Lk. 1: 46-48, 49* My soul doth magnify the Lord: and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior: because He hath regarded the humility of His handmaid. He that is mighty hath done great things to me.

SECRET: May the holy prayers of Saint Therese Thy Virgin, we beseech Thee, commend our sacrifice to Thee, O Lord: in her honor we solemnly offer it: in view then of her merits do Thou accept it. Through our Lord...

COMMUNION: *Deut. 32: 10-12* He led her about and taught her, and He kept her as the apple of His eye. As an eagle He has spread His wings and hath taken her on His shoulder. The Lord alone was her leader.

POSTCOMMUNION: May the heavenly mystery, O Lord, inflame us with the fire of that love by which Saint Therese, Thy Virgin, offered herself to Thee as a victim of charity for mankind. Through our Lord...
