On the Benefits of Praying the Rosary Publicly

Excerpts from *The Secret of the Rosary* by St. Louis de Montfort

Of all the ways of saying the holy Rosary, the most glorious to God, most salutary to our souls, and the most terrible to the devil is that of saying or chanting the Rosary publicly. Our Lord expressly recommended this practice to his apostles and disciples, and promised that whenever there would be at least two or three gathered in his name he would be there in the midst of them.

This way of praying is of the greatest benefit to us:

- ◆ Because our minds are usually more alert during public prayer than when we pray alone;
- ◆ When we pray in common, the prayer of each one belongs to the whole group and make all together but one prayer, so that if one person is not praying well, someone else in the same gathering who is praying better makes up for his deficiency. In the same way, those who are strong uphold the weak, those who are fervent inspire the lukewarm, the rich enrich the poor, the bad are merged with the good.
- ◆ One who says his Rosary alone only gains the merit of one Rosary; but if he says it with thirty other people he gains the merit of thirty Rosaries. This is the law of public prayer. How profitable, how advantageous this is!
- ◆ Public prayer is more powerful than private prayer to appease the anger of God and call down his mercy, and the Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, has always advocated it in times of disasters and general distress.
- ◆ In his Bull on the Rosary, Pope Gregory XIII declares that the public prayers and processions of the members of the Confraternity of the Holy Rosary were largely responsible for the great victory over the Turkish navy at Lepanto, which God granted to the Christians on the first Sunday of October 1571.

Pious Instructions from St. Francis de Sales on Praying the Holy Rosary:

- Kiss the cross of your [Rosary] after having signed yourself therewith, and place yourself in the presence of God, saying the Creed.
- On the first large bead, beg God to accept the service you wish to render Him, and to assist you by His grace to accomplish it worthily.
- On the first three small beads, implore the intercession of the Sacred Virgin, saluting her: on the *first*, as the most cherished daughter of God the Father; on the *second*, as Mother of God the Son; and on the *third*, as the beloved Spouse of God the Holy Ghost.
- At each decade think of one of the Mysteries of the Rosary according to your leisure, remembering it principally when pronouncing the holy names of Jesus and Mary with great reverence of heart and body. If any other sentiment should animate you (sorrow for past sin or a purpose of amendment) meditate thereon throughout the chaplet as well as you can, recalling this sentiment or any other that God may inspire in a special manner when murmuring the sacred names of Jesus and Mary.
- [At the end] thank God for having been permitted to recite your chaplet; salute the most holy Virgin Mary, entreating her: [first], to offer your understanding to the Eternal Father that you may continually consider His mercies; [second], supplicate her to offer your memory to the Son that your thoughts may constantly turn to His Passion and Death; and [third], implore her to offer your will to the Holy Ghost that it may ever be inflamed with His holy love. . . Begin the divine Majesty to accept all for His glory and the good of His Church, asking Him to keep you ever in its pale and to bring back those who have wandered; pray for your friends, and conclude as you commenced by the profession of faith, the Sign of the Cross.

Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: *Ecclus. 36: 18* Give peace, O Lord, to them that patiently wait for Thee, that Thy prophets may be found faithful: hear the prayers of Thy servant, and of Thy people Israel. *Ps. 121: 1* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord. Glory be. Give peace, O Lord...

COLLECT: Let the exercise of Thy compassion, we beseech Thee, O Lord, direct our hearts: for without Thee we are not able to please Thee. Through our Lord...

EPISTLE: *1 Cor. 1: 4-8* Brethren, I give thanks to my God always for you, for the grace of God that is given you in Jesus Christ, that in all things you are made rich in Him in all utterance and in all knowledge, as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you; so that nothing is wanting to you in any grace, waiting for the manifestation of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Who also will confirm you unto the end without crime, in the day of the coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

GRADUAL: *Ps. 121: 1, 7* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go into the house of our Lord. Let peace be in thy strength, and abundance in thy towers.

ALLELUIA: *Ps. 101: 16* Alleluia, alleluia. The Gentiles shall fear Thy name, O Lord: and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Mt. 9: 1-8* At that time, Jesus entering into a boat, passed over the water and came into His own city. And behold they brought

Him one sick of the palsy lying in a bed; and Jesus seeing their faith, said to the man sick of the palsy: Be of good heart, son, thy sins are forgiven thee. And behold some of the scribes said within themselves: He blasphemeth. And Jesus seeing their thoughts, said: Why do you think evil in your hearts? whether is easier to say: Thy sins are forgiven thee, or to say: Arise and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins (then said He to the man sick of the palsy): Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house. And he arose, and went into his house. And the multitude seeing it feared and glorified God Who had given such power to men.

OFFERTORY: *Ex. 24: 4, 5* Moses consecrated an altar to the Lord, offering upon it holocausts, and sacrificing victims: he made an evening sacrifice to the Lord God for an odor of sweetness, in the sight of the children of Israel.

SECRET: O God, Who, by Thy venerable intercourse with us in this Sacrifice dost make us partakers of the one Supreme Godhead: grant, we beseech Thee, that as we know Thy truth, so we may follow it by worthy lives.

COMMUNION: *Ps. 95: 8-9* Bring up sacrifices, and come into His courts: adore ye the Lord in His holy court.

POSTCOMMUNION: We have been renewed, O Lord, by Thy sacred Gift, and thank Thee, beseeching Thee in Thy mercy to make us worthy partakers in It. Through our Lord...
