



General Remarks On Indulgences

From the Office of the Apostolic Penitentiary

An **indulgence** is defined in the Code of Canon Law (can. 992) and in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 1471) as “a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints.”

In general, the gaining of indulgences requires certain prescribed conditions, and the performance of certain prescribed works. A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day.

In order to obtain the indulgence, the faithful must also

- be in the state of grace at least at the time the indulgenced work is completed;
- have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
- have sacramentally confessed their sins;
- receive Holy Communion;
- pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.

It is appropriate, but not necessary, that the sacramental Confession and especially Holy Communion and the prayer for the Pope’s intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is performed; but it is sufficient that these sacred rites and prayers be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the indulgenced act. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father’s intentions are required for each plenary indulgence. Prayer for the Pope’s intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an “Our Father” and a “Hail Mary” are suggested. The Pope’s intentions are four in number : 1. The progress of the Faith and triumph of the Church; 2. Peace and union among Christian Princes and Rulers; 3. The conversion of sinners; 4. The uprooting of heresy. Indulgences can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons still living.

During the month of November, dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory, moved by charity for their succor, let us strive to gain as many indulgences as possible for their deliverance from their sins to soon share in the joys of Heaven!



A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory is granted each and every day from **Nov 1 to Nov 8**, those faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and there pray, if only mentally, for the departed (with the usual requirements).

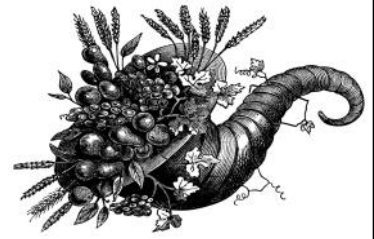

GOSPEL: *Mt. 22: 15-21* *+ Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew*

At that time, the Pharisees went and consulted among themselves, how to ensnare Jesus in His speech. And they sent to Him their disciples, with

the Herodians, Saying: Master, we know that Thou art a true speaker, and teachest the way of God in truth, neither carest Thou for any man, for Thou dost not regard the person of men. Tell us therefore, what dost Thou think? Is it lawful to give tribute to Caesar, or not? But Jesus knowing their wickedness, said: Why do you tempt Me, you hypocrites? Show Me the coin of the tribute. And they offered Him a penny. And Jesus saith to them: Whose image and superscription is this? They say to Him: Caesar's. Then He saith to them: Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's.

OFFERTORY: *Esther 14:12-13* Remember me, O Lord, Thou Who rulest above all power; and give a well-ordered speech in my mouth, that my words may be pleasing in the sight of the prince.

SECRET: Grant unto us, O merciful God, that this saving oblation may unceasingly free us from our own guilty deeds, and keep us from all things that may hurt us. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION: *Ps. 16:6* I have cried, for Thou, O God, hast heard me: O incline Thine ear unto me, and hear my words.

POSTCOMMUNION: We have received, O Lord, the gifts of this sacred Mystery, and humbly beseech Thee: that what Thou hast bidden us to do in memory of Thee may avail us in our weakness. Who livest and reignest.
