


Thought from St. Francis de Sales:

There is no need to doubt that we possess faith in God, simply because we find it difficult to keep clear of sin, or find ourselves diffident or even fearing that we will not be able to resist occasions of temptation. No! Diffidence in our strength of will is not due to lack of resolve but is a

true acknowledgement of our misery. The fear of being able to resist temptations is better than considering ourselves strong and secure, because all that we do not expect from our own strength we hope to receive by means of God's grace...We must simply be on our guard and be humble so as not to fall victim to temptation.

Third Sunday of Advent ("Gaudete" Sunday)

INTROIT: *Phil. 4: 4-6; Ps. 84:* 2 Rejoice in the Lord always: again I say, rejoice. Let your modesty be known to all men: for the Lord is nigh. Be nothing solicitous: but in every thing by prayer let your petitions be made known to God. (Ps) Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. Glory be. Rejoice in the Lord...

COLLECT: Incline Thine ear, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to our petitions: and, by the grace of Thy visitation, enlighten the darkness of our minds: Who livest and reignest.

EPISTLE: Phil. 4: 4-7 Lesson from the Epistle of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Philippians

Brethren, Rejoice in the Lord always: again, I say, rejoice. Let your modesty be known to all men.

The Lord is nigh. Be nothing solicitous: but in every thing, by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your petitions be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasseth all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus Our Lord.

GRADUAL: Ps. 79: 2,3,2 Thou, O Lord, that sittest upon the Cherubim, stir up Thy might and come. Give ear, O Thou that rulest Israel: that leadest Joseph like a sheep.

ALLELUIA: Alleluia, alleluia. Stir up, O Lord, Thy might, and come to save us. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Jn. 1: 19-28 + Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. John

At that time the Jews sent from Jerusalem Priests and Levites to John, to ask him: Who art thou? And he confessed, and did not deny; and he confessed: I am not the Christ. And they asked him: What then? Art thou Elias? And he said: I am not. Art thou the Prophet? And he answered: No. They said therefore unto him: Who art thou, that we may give an answer to them that sent us? What sayest thou of thyself? He said: I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness: Make straight the way of the Lord, as said the Prophet Isaias. And they that were sent were of the Pharisees. And they asked him, and said to him: Why then dost thou baptize, if thou be not Christ, nor Elias, nor the Prophet? John answered them, saying: I baptize with water: but there hath stood one in the midst of you, Whom you know not. The same is He that shall come after me, Who is preferred before me: the latchet of Whose shoe I am not worthy to loose. These things were done in Bethania, beyond the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

OFFERTORY: Ps. 84: 2,3 Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob: Thou hast forgiven the iniquity of Thy people.

SECRET: May the Sacrifice of our devotion, we beseech Thee, O Lord, be continually offered up to Thee: may it both complete the institution of the holy mysteries, and wondrously accomplish in us Thy salvation. Through Our Lord.

COMMUNION: *Is.* 35: 4 Say: Ye fainthearted, take courage and fear not: behold our God will come, and will save us.

POSTCOMMUNION: We implore, O Lord, Thy mercy: that these divine helps may expiate our sins, and prepare us for the approaching feast. Through Our Lord.

Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

INTROIT: Sedulius; Ps. 44:2 Hail, holy Parent, that didst bring forth the King Who ruleth heaven and earth for ever and ever. (Psalm) My heart hath uttered a good word: I speak of my works



to the King. Glory be. Hail, holy Parent...

COLLECT: O God, Who hast willed that, placed as we are under the especial patronage of the most blessed Virgin Mary, we should receive an abundant measure of unceasing favors: grant to us, Thy suppliant people, whose joy it is this day to honor her upon earth, forevermore to be made happy by seeing her in heaven. Through Our Lord.

Wisdom As the vine I have brought forth a pleasant odor, and my flowers are the fruit of honor and riches. I am the mother of fair love, and of fear, and of knowledge, and of holy hope. In me is all grace of the way and of the truth, in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Come over to me, and be filled with my fruits; for my spirit is sweet above honey, and my inheritance above honey and the honey-comb. My memory is unto everlasting generations. They that eat me, shall yet hunger; and they that drink me, shall yet thirst. He that hearkeneth to me, shall not sin. They that explain me, shall have life everlasting.

GRADUAL: Cant. 6: 9; Ecclus. 50: 8 Who is she that cometh forth as the morning rising, fair as the moon, bright as the sun? As the rainbow giving light in the bright clouds, and as the flower of roses in the days of spring.

ALLELUIA: Alleluia, alleluia. The flowers have appeared in our land, the time of pruning is come.

GOSPEL: Lk. 1: 39-47 At that time Mary rising up, went into the hill country with haste into a city of Juda: and she entered into the house of Zachary,

and saluted Elizabeth. And it came to pass, that when Elizabeth heard the salutation of Mary, the infant leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Ghost: and she cried out with a loud voice, and said: Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb. And whence is this to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For behold as soon as the voice of thy salutation sounded in my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. And blessed art thou that hast believed, because these things shall be accomplished that were spoken to thee by the Lord. And Mary said: My soul doth magnify the Lord: and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior.

OFFERTORY: **II Par.** 7:16 I have chosen, and have sanctified this place, that my name may be there, and my eyes and my heart may remain there for evermore.

SECRET: By Thy gracious mercy, O Lord, and by the intercession of Blessed Mary ever Virgin, may this oblation avail us for peace and welfare both now and forevermore. Through Our Lord.

COMMUNION: Ps. 147: 20 He hath not done in like manner to every nation; and His judgments He hath not made manifest to them.

POSTCOMMUNION: O Lord, grant, we beseech Thee, that we who have received these aids unto salvation, may be always and everywhere protected by the intercession of Blessed Mary ever Virgin, in veneration of whom we have offered up these gifts to Thy Majesty. Through Our Lord.

O Divine Infant Jesus, I have recourse to Thee. Please, through Thy Blessed Mother, assist me in this necessity (mention intention here), because I firmly believe that Thy Divinity can help me. I hope with confidence to obtain Thy holy grace. I love Thee with all my heart and with all the strength of my soul. I repent sincerely of my sins and I beg Thee, O Good Jesus, to grant me the strength to triumph over them. I resolve never more to offend Thee and I come to offer myself to Thee with the intention of enduring everything rather than to displease Thee. Henceforth, I desire to serve Thee with fidelity and, for the love of Thee, O Divine Infant, I will love my neighbor as myself. All powerful Infant, O Jesus, I implore Thee again, assist me in this need. Grant me the grace of possessing Thee eternally with Mary and Joseph and of adoring Thee with the angels in the heavenly court. Amen.

Dec. 17 **O** Wisdom, * which came out of the mouth of the Most High, and reachest from one end to another, mightily and sweetly ordering all things: Come and teach us the way of prudence.

Dec. 18 **O Adonai**, * and Leader of the house of Israel, who appearedst in the Bush to Moses in a flame of fire, and gavest him the Law of Sinai: Come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.

Dec. 19 **O Root of Jesse**, * which standest for an ensign of the people, at whom kings shall shut their mouths, to whom the Gentiles shall seek: Come and deliver us, and tarry not.

Dec. 20 **O** Key of David, * and Sceptre of the house of Israel; that openest and no man shutteth, and shuttest and no man openeth: Come and bring the prisoners out of the prison-house, them that sit in darkness and the shadow of death.

Dec. 21 **O Dayspring**, * Brightness of Light Everlasting, and Sun of Righteousness: Come and enlighten them that sit in darkness and the shadow of death.

Dec. 22 **O** King of the Nations, * and their Desire; the Cornerstone who makest both one: Come and save mankind, whom Thou formedst of clay.

Dec. 23 **O Emmanuel**, * our King and Lawgiver, Desire of all nations and their Salvation: Come and save us, O Lord our God.

Each day after the corresponding "O" Antiphon:

V. Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the skies pour down righteousness.

R. Let the earth open, and bring forth a Savior.

During 3rd Week of Advent:

Let us pray. Incline Thine ear, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to our prayers: and make bright the darkness of our minds by the grace of Thy visitation. Who livest and reignest, world without end. R. Amen.

During 4th Week of Advent:

Let us pray. Stir up, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy power, and come; make haste to our aid with Thy great might; that, by the help of Thy grace, that which is hindered by our sins may be hastened by Thy merciful forgiveness. Who livest and reignest, world without end. R. Amen.
