Last Wednesday, on Dec. 28, the fourth day of Christmas, the feast of the Holy Innocents, we marked a very important moment in the life of the Institute's patron St. Francis de Sales. On December 28th 1622, 400 years ago, the Bishop of Geneva died in the odor of sanctity while in Lyon, France. To celebrate this important anniversary of his *dies natalis*, this upcoming year at the Oratory will be the "Year of St. Francis de Sales."

1) His upcoming feast next month, January 29th, will be preceded by a nine-day novena.

2) As his feast day is on the 29th of January, he will be commemorated this year in a particular way with a sermon during the Mass on the 29th of each month followed by special devotions to be recited afterwards.

3) Throughout the year spiritual conferences and resources on St. Francis de Sales will also be released highlighting his spirituality and life earning him the title "Doctor of Charity."

Please join us for these spiritual devotions and this great opportunity to learn more about and learn more from this important Saint for our times!

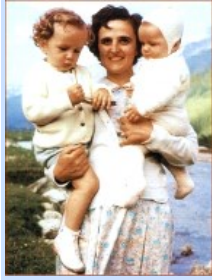

From the Dom Gueranger's Liturgical Year

Jan. 6th "Epiphany of Our Lord"

Epiphany, Baptism of Jesus, Miracle at Cana ...But, did these three Mysteries really take place on this day? Is the 6th of January the real anniversary of these great events? As the chief object of this work is to assist the devotion of the Faithful, we purposely avoid everything which would savour of critical discussion; and with regard to the present question, we think it enough to state, that Baronius, Suarez, Theophilus Raynaldus, Honorius De Sancta-Maria, Cardinal Gotti, Sandini, Benedict XIV, and an almost endless list of other writers, assert that the Adoration of the Magi happened on this very day. That the Baptism of our Lord also happened on the 6th of January, is admitted by the severest historical critics, even by Tillemont himself; and has been denied by only two or three. The precise day of the miracle at the marriage-feast of Cana is far from being as certain as the other two mysteries, though it is impossible to prove that the 6th of January was not the day. For us, the children of the Church, it is sufficient that our Holy Mother Church has assigned the commemoration of these three manifestations for this Feast; we need nothing more to make us rejoice in the triple triumph of the Son of Mary.

Feast of the Circumcision of Our Lord**

INTROIT: *Isaias 9, 6* A Child is born to us, and a Son is given to us: whose government is upon His shoulder: and His name shall be called the Angel of great counsel. (*Ps.*) Sing ye to the Lord a new canticle: because He hath done wonderful things. Glory be...

COLLECT: O God, who through the fruitful virginity of blessed Mary didst secure for mankind the reward of eternal salvation; grant, we beseech Thee, that we may experience her intercession for us, through whom we have been made worthy to receive the Author of life, our Lord Jesus Christ Thy Son: Who with thee...

EPISTLE: *Tit. 2: 11-15* Lesson from the Epistle of Blessed Paul the Apostle to Titus.

Beloved: the grace of God our Savior has appeared to all men, instructing us, in order that, rejecting ungodliness and worldly lusts, we may live temperately and justly and piously in this world; looking for the blessed hope and glorious coming of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us that he might redeem us from all iniquity and cleanse for himself an acceptable people, pursuing good works. Thus speak, and exhort, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GRADUAL: *Ps. 97: 3-4 & 2* All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God: sing joyfully to God, all the earth. The Lord hath made known His salvation: He hath revealed His justice in the sight of the nations.

ALLELUIA. Alleluia, alleluia. *Hebr. 1, 1-2.* God, Who in divers manners spoke in times past to the fathers by the prophets, last of all in these days hath spoken to us by His Son. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Lk. 2: 21* †Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Luke. At that time, when eight days were fulfilled for the circumcision of the Child, His name was called Jesus, the name given Him by the angel before He was conceived in the womb.

OFFERTORY: *Ps. 88: 12 & 15* Thine are the heavens, and Thine is the earth, the world and the fullness thereof Thou hast founded: justice and judgment are the preparation of Thy throne.

SECRET: Receive, we beseech Thee, O Lord, our offerings and prayers, cleansing us by these heavenly mysteries, and mercifully hearing us. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION: *Ps. 97: 3* All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

POSTCOMMUNION: May this communion, O Lord, cleanse us from all sin, and by the intercession of the blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, make us partakers of the heavenly remedy. Through the same... Amen.

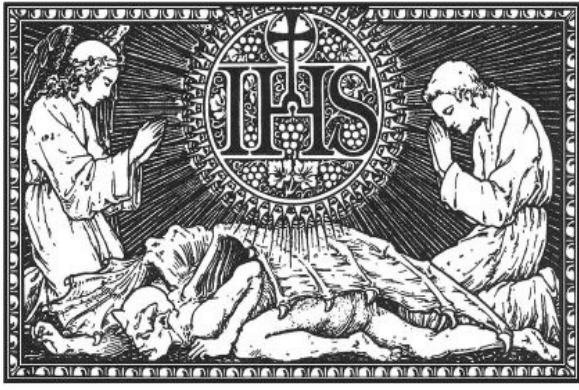

THE MOST HOLY NAME OF JESUS



INTROIT *Philippians 2.10-11* In the Name of Jesus let every knee bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth; and let every tongue confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father. *Ps. 8. 2.* O Lord, our Lord, how wonderful is Thy Name in the whole earth. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, Who didst appoint Thine only-begotten Son the Savior of mankind, and didst bid that He should be called Jesus: mercifully grant that we may enjoy the vision of Him in Heaven, Whose holy Name we venerate on earth. Through the same our Lord.

EPISTLE *Acts 4. 8-12* In those days: Peter filled with the Holy Ghost, said to them: Ye princes of the people and ancients, hear: If we this day are examined concerning the good deed done to the infirm man, by what means he hath been made whole, be it known to you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ of Nazareth, Whom you crucified, Whom God hath raised from the dead, even by Him this man standeth before you whole. This is the stone which was rejected by you the builders, which is become the head of the corner: neither is there salvation in any other. For there is no other name under heaven given to men, whereby we must be saved.

GRADUAL *Psalm 105. 47* Save us, O Lord our God, and gather us from among the nations: that we may give thanks to Thy holy Name, and may glory in Thy praise. *V.* Thou, O Lord, art our Father and Redeemer, Thy Name is from eternity.

ALLELUIA, *alleluia. V.* My mouth shall speak the praise of the Lord, and let all flesh bless His holy Name. Alleluia.

GOSPEL *Luke 2: 21* At that time: After eight days were accomplished that the child should be circumcised; His Name was called Jesus, which was called by the Angel before He was conceived in the womb.

OFFERTORY *Psalms 85. 12, 5* I will praise Thee, O Lord my God, with my whole heart, and I will glorify Thy Name for ever; for Thou, O Lord, art sweet and mild, and plenteous in mercy to all that call upon Thee, alleluia.

SECRET May Thy blessing, by which all creatures live, hallow, we beseech Thee, most merciful God, this our sacrifice which we offer to Thee to the glory of the Name of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, that it may please Thy majesty and bring Thee praise, and avail us unto salvation. Through the same our Lord.

PREFACE OF THE NATIVITY It is truly meet and just, right and availing unto salvation that we should at all times and in all places give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty and everlasting God. Because by the mystery of the Word made flesh the light of Thy glory hath shone anew upon the eyes of our mind: that while we acknowledge Him to be God seen by men, we may be drawn by Him to the love of things unseen. And therefore with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominations, and with all the heavenly hosts, we sing a hymn to Thy glory, saying without ceasing:

COMMUNION *Psalms 97. 3* All the nations Thou hast made shall come and adore before Thee, O Lord; and they shall glorify Thy Name: for Thou art great, and dost wonderful things: Thou art God alone, alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION O almighty and everlasting God Who didst create and redeem us, look graciously upon our prayer, and with a favorable and benign countenance deign to accept the sacrifice of the saving Victim, which we have offered to Thy Majesty in honor of the Name of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ: that through the infusion of Thy grace we may rejoice that our names are written in heaven, under the glorious Name of Jesus, the pledge of eternal predestination. Through the same our Lord.



Epiphany of Our Lord

Introit *Mal 3:1; 1 Par. 29:12* Behold, the Lord and Ruler is come; and the kingdom is in His hand, and power, and dominion. *Ps 71:1*
V. O God, with Your judgment endow the King, and with Your justice, the King's Son. *V.* Glory be to the Father,...**Behold...**

Collect O God, You Who by the guidance of a star this day revealed Your only-begotten Son to the Gentiles; mercifully grant that we who know You now by faith, may come to behold You in glory. **Through the...**

Lesson *Isa 60:1-6* Rise up in splendor, O Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the Lord shines, and over you appears His glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. Raise your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you: your sons come from afar, and your daughters in the arms of their nurses. Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you, the wealth of nations shall be brought to you. Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Madian and Ephah; all from Saba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the Lord.

Gradual *Isa 60:6, 1.* All they from Saba shall come, bringing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the Lord. *V.* Rise up in splendor, O Jerusalem, for the glory of the Lord shines upon you. Alleluia, alleluia. *Matt 2:2* *V.* We have seen His star in the East: and have come with gifts to worship the Lord. Alleluia.

Gospel *Matt 2:1-12* When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, Magi came from the East to Jerusalem, saying, Where is He that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the east and have come to worship Him. But when King Herod heard this, he was troubled, and so was all Jerusalem with him. And gathering together all the chief priests and Scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. And they said to him, In Bethlehem of Judea; for thus it is written by the prophet, 'And you, Bethlehem, of the land of Juda, are by no means least among the princes of Juda; for from you shall come forth a leader who shall rule My people Israel.' Then Herod summoned the Magi secretly, and carefully ascertained from them the time when the star had appeared to them. And sending them to Bethlehem, he said, Go and make careful inquiry concerning the Child, and when you have found Him, bring me word, that I too may go and worship Him. Now they, having heard the king, went their way. And behold, the star that they had seen in the East went before them, until it came and stood over the place where the Child was. And when they saw the star they rejoiced exceedingly. And entering the house, they found the Child with Mary His Mother, genuflect and falling down they worshipped Him. And opening their treasures they offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they went back to their own country by another way.

Offertory *Ps 71:10-11* The kings of Tharsis and the Isles shall offer gifts; the kings of Arabia and Saba shall bring tribute. All kings shall pay Him homage, all nations shall serve Him.

Secret O Lord, look favorably upon the gifts of Your Church, which are no longer gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, but, as these gifts signify, our offering is Jesus Christ Your Son, our Lord, Who is now sacrifice and food. **Who livest...**

Communion *Matt 2:2* We have seen His star in the East and have come with gifts to worship the Lord.

Post Communion Grant, we beseech You, almighty God, that, by the understanding of our minds made pure, we may grasp what we celebrate by these solemn rites. **Through Jesus Christ...**
