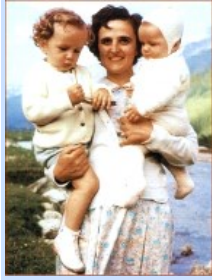
SUNG VESPERS OF SUNDAY

Furthermore, my child, you should endeavor to assist at the Offices, Hours, Vespers, etc., as far as you are able, especially on Sundays and Festivals, days which are dedicated to God, wherein we ought to strive to do more for His Honor and Glory than on others. You will greatly increase the fervor of your devotion by so doing, even as did Saint Augustine, who tells us in his Confessions, that in the early days of his conversion he was touched to the quick, and his heart overflowed in happy tears, when he took part in the Offices of the Church. Moreover (let me say it here once for all), there is always more profit and more consolation in the public Offices of the Church than in private acts of devotion, God having willed to give the preference to communion in prayer over all individual action.

I say the same concerning all public services and prayers, in which, as far as possible, each one of us is bound to contribute the best example we can for our neighbor's edification, and our hearty desire for God's Glory and the general good of all men.

MAY 8th, FEAST OF THE APPARITION OF ST. MICHAEL

Let us reverently honor these princely heralds of our deliverance, and consider how respectfully they cluster round Jesus their King and God during the forty days after His Resurrection. They adore this glorified Humanity which they are soon to see raised up to the highest heavens and throned at the Father's right hand. They rejoice with us in the happiness brought to us by this Paschal Feast, which restores immortality to us in the person of our Risen Savior. It was right therefore that Paschal Time should devote one of its days to honoring the Angelic Spirits. Eight days previous to the Annunciation, we kept the feast of St. Gabriel, our Lady's honored messenger; today it is St. Michael, the Archangel and Prince of the heavenly host, that is to receive our love and praise. He himself selected this day by appearing on it and leaving us a pledge of his presence and protection.

The very name of Michael urges us to honor this glorious Spirit; it is a cry of enthusiasm and fidelity for it signifies: *"Who is like unto God?"* Satan trembles at hearing this name, for it reminds him of the noble protest where-with the bright Archangel answered the call of the rebel angels. Michael proved his strength and prowess when he fought the great battle in heaven. On that account, he was made the Guardian and Protector of God's people; of the Jews first, and afterwards, of the Christian Church, for the Synagogue forfeited all her honors. Michael now watches over Jesus' Spouse, our Mother; he supports Her in her trials, and She wins no triumph in which he has not had some hand.

Thought from St. Francis de Sales:

Be patient, not only as regards severe afflictions that come your way, but also regarding accidental circumstances that cause annoyance. For example, we must be patient in sickness, but we must also accept its attending circumstances of place and time and its accompanying difficulties. The same must be said about other tribulations.

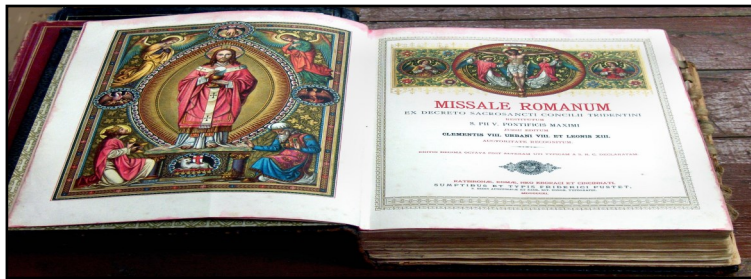

FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

INTROIT: *Ps. 97: 1,2* Sing ye to the Lord a new canticle, alleluia, for the Lord hath done wonderful things, alleluia; He hath revealed His justice in the sight of the Gentiles, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. (Ps) His right hand, and His holy arm, hath gotten Him the victory. Glory be. Sing ye to the Lord...

COLLECT

O God, Who makest the faithful to be of one mind and will: grant to Thy people the grace to love what Thou dost command and to desire what Thou dost promise, that amid the changes of the world, our hearts may there be fixed where true joys are to be found. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Jas. 1: 17-21 Letter from St. James the Apostle*

Dearly beloved, every best gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with Whom there is no change nor shadow of alteration. For of His own will hath He begotten us by the word of truth, that we might be some beginning of His creature. You know, my dearest brethren. And let every man be swift to hear but slow to speak and slow to anger. For the anger of man worketh not the justice of God. Wherefore, casting away all uncleanness and abundance of naughtiness, with meekness receive the ingrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

PASCHAL ALLELUIA: *Ps. 117: 16; Rom. 6: 9* Alleluia, alleluia. The right hand of the Lord hath wrought strength, the right hand of the Lord hath exalted me. Alleluia. Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more: death shall no more have dominion over Him. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Jn. 16: 5-14*

+Continuation of the Holy Gospel according to St. John

At that time Jesus said to His disciples: I go to Him that sent Me: and none of you asketh Me: Whither goest Thou? But because I have spoken these things to you, sorrow hath filled your heart. But I tell you the truth: it is expedient to you that I go, for if I go not, the Paraclete will not come to you: but if I go, I will send Him to you. And when He is come, He will convince the world of sin and of justice and of judgment. Of sin, because they believed not in Me: and of justice, because I go to the Father, and you shall see Me no longer: and of judgment, because the prince of this world is already judged. I have yet many things to say to you; but you cannot bear them now. But when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will teach you all truth. For He shall not speak of Himself: but what things soever He shall hear He shall speak; and the things that are to come, He shall show you. He shall glorify Me: because He shall receive of Mine and shall show it to you.

OFFERTORY: *Ps. 65: 1, 2, 16* Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His name: come and hear, and I will tell you, all ye that fear God, what great things the Lord hath done for my soul, alleluia.

SECRET: O God, Who by the holy interchange of this sacrifice dost make us partakers of the One Supreme Godhead: grant, we beseech Thee, that as we know Thy truth, so we may worthily live it. Through Our Lord.

COMMUNION: *Jn. 16: 8* When the Paraclete, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will convince the world of sin and of justice and of judgment, alleluia, alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION: Stand by us, O Lord our God, so that what we have confidently received may cleanse us from every vice and free us from every danger. Through Our Lord.
