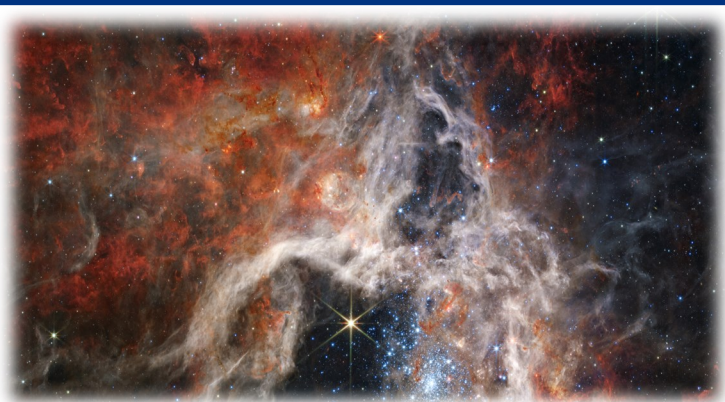

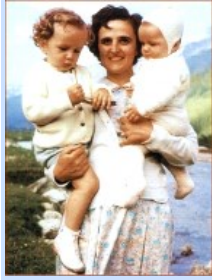

Like the Easter Vigil, this is a very beautiful liturgy when Catechumens would come into the church in commemoration of the preaching of St. Peter and the baptizing of 3000 souls (*Acts 2:41*). There are six Prophecies, the Blessing of Water, Baptisms and Confirmations, Litany of Saints and Holy Mass.

Teaching from the 6 Prophecies at the Pentecost Vigil

1) In Baptism and faith in Christ, neophytes are the promised children of Abraham. 2) Baptism rescues the catechumens from the devil as Moses through the Red Sea rescued the Israelites from slavery. 3) Moses taught the Jews by composing a canticle for their conduct, so in God's mercy may the neophytes' fear of punishment be transformed to happiness. 4) Like a vine brought out from Egypt through water, so may the neophytes be cultivated and bear everlasting fruit in Christ by the care of the Church. 5) The prophets instruct us to despise the things of this world and hasten to that which is eternal, to know and follow God's ways. 6) The dried bones that stood up, took on flesh and received a spirit at the prophesying of Ezechiel foreshadows the soul of the catechumen rising in baptism to new life and with the spirit of God in them.

Thought from St. Francis de Sales:

When we have to suffer some little misfortunes, we often do the opposite of what the Divine Master has taught us. We complain and feel sorry for ourselves, telling everyone our troubles in the most minute details. We think that our trouble is insupportable, small though it may be, and that the sufferings of others are nothing in comparison with ours. So we become impatient and make a nuisance of ourselves. In a word, it is pitiable to see how poorly we imitate the patience of Jesus Christ. Forgetting His own suffering, He was in no way anxious that people knew about them; it was sufficient for Him that His Heavenly Father knew.

From the Rector's Desk:

Dear Faithful,

The 2nd holiest day of the Liturgical Year for Catholics is the Feast of Pentecost. Along with Easter (in the EF calendar), it has an octave of 1st class feasts during which no other liturgical feast can be celebrated. Going back at least to Pope St. Siricius (384-399) and Pope St. Leo the Great (440-461), at the Vigil of Pentecost many catechumens were baptized in honor of St. Peter baptizing 3000 souls on the 1st Pentecost after Our Lord's Ascension. If Catechumens were sick or not yet sufficiently instructed by the Vigil of Easter, the Church had this liturgy wisely set aside as well to regenerate souls in the Holy Ghost. The traditional liturgy of the Vigil of Pentecost mirrors that of the Easter Vigil with only a few omissions (i.e. no blessing of fire and no Exultet). With the altar and ministers vested in violet, the liturgy begins with the chanting of 6 Prophecies, 4 Tracts, 6 Collects (see below), and then continues with the Blessing of the Baptismal Font with possible Baptisms and Confirmations followed by the Litany of the Saints. The ministers then change to red vestments and begin the Mass. The Mass makes many allusions to Baptism and Confirmation which give us life in the Holy Ghost and strengthen and confirm us in His grace. Special note of the Mass: there is no Introit (like at the Easter Vigil), bells are rung at the Gloria, Alleluia and Tract of Easter Vigil, acolytes don't carry candles at the Gospel, Proper *Communicantes* of Pentecost and Proper *Hanc Igitur* in the Eucharistic Canon. Unfortunately in 1955, everything preceding the Mass (Prophecies, Collects, Blessing of Font and Baptisms, Litany of Saints) was suppressed from the Vigil leaving only the Mass. Join us this Saturday, May 27th, at 9am for this ancient liturgy!

SUNDAY AFTER THE ASCENSION

INTROIT: Ps. 26: 7-9 Hear O Lord, my voice with which I have cried to Thee, alleluia; my heart hath said to Thee, I have sought Thy face, Thy face, O Lord, I will seek: turn not away Thy face from me, alleluia, alleluia. Ps. The Lord is my light and my salvation: whom shall I fear? Glory be. Hear O Lord, my voice.....

COLLECT: Almighty and eternal God, grant us ever to have a will devoted to Thee, and with a sincere heart to serve Thy majesty. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: 1 Peter. 4: 7-11 Dearly beloved, be prudent and watch in prayers. But before all things have a constant mutual charity among yourselves: for charity covereth a multitude of sins. Using hospitality one towards another, without murmuring: as every man hath received grace, ministering the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If any man speak, let him speak, as the words of God: if any minister, let him do it, as of the power which God administereth: that in all things God may be honoured through Jesus Christ our Lord.

PASCHAL ALLELUIA: Alleluia, alleluia. The Lord hath reigned over all the nations; God sitteth on His holy throne. Alleluia. I will not leave you orphans: I go away, and I come unto you, and your heart shall rejoice. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Jn. 13,26-27; 16:1-4 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: When the Paraclete cometh, whom I will send you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, who proceedeth from the Father, He shall give testimony of Me: and you shall give testimony, because you are with Me from the beginning. These things have I spoken to you, that you may not be

scandalized. They will put you out of the synagogues; yea, the hour cometh, that whosoever killeth you will think that he doth a service to God. And these things will they do to you, because they have not known the Father, nor Me. But these things I have told you, that, when the hour shall come, you may remember that I told you of them.

OFFERTORY: Ps. 46: 6 God is ascended with jubilee, and the Lord with the sound of a trumpet, alleluia

SECRET: May these spotless sacrifices cleanse us, O Lord, and instil into our souls the strength of Thy heavenly grace. Through our Lord.

PREFACE OF THE ASCENSION: It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God: through Christ our Lord. Who, after His Resurrection, appeared openly to all His disciples, and, while they looked on, was taken up into heaven, that He might grant unto us to be sharers in His own divinity. And therefore, with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominations, and with all the hosts of the heavenly army, we sing the hymn of Thy glory, evermore saying: Holy, Holy, Holy...

COMMUNION: John 17: 12-13, 15 Father, while I was with them, I kept them whom Thou gavest Me, alleluia; but now I come to Thee: I pray not that Thou shouldst take them out of the world, but that Thou shouldst keep them from evil, alleluia, alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION: Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that being replenished with holy gifts, we may ever remain in thanksgiving. Through our Lord.

Novena to the Holy Ghost

FIRST DAY

*Holy Spirit! Lord of Light!

The Holy Ghost

Only one thing is important -- eternal salvation. Only one thing, therefore, is to be feared -- sin. Sin is the result of ignorance, weakness, and indifference. The Holy Ghost is the Spirit of Light, of Strength, and of Love. With His sevenfold gifts He enlightens the mind, strengthens the will, and inflames the heart with love of God. To ensure our salvation we ought to invoke the Divine Spirit daily, for "The Spirit helpeth our infirmity. We know not what we should pray for as we ought. But the Spirit Himself asketh for us."

Prayer

Almighty and eternal God, Who hast vouchsafed to regenerate us by water and the Holy Ghost, and hast given us forgiveness all sins, vouchsafe to send forth from heaven upon us Thy sevenfold Spirit, the Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding, the Spirit of Counsel and fortitude, the Spirit of Knowledge and Piety, and fill us with the Spirit of Holy Fear. The Gift of Fear

The gift of Fear fills us with a sovereign respect for God, and makes us dread nothing so much as to offend Him by sin. It is a fear that arises, not from the thought of hell, but from sentiments of reverence and filial submission to our heavenly Father. It is the fear that is the beginning of wisdom, detaching us from worldly pleasures that could in any way separate us from God. "They that fear the Lord will prepare their hearts, and in His sight will sanctify their souls."

Prayer

Come, O blessed Spirit of Holy Fear, penetrate my inmost heart, that I may set Thee, my Lord and God, before my face forever, help me to shun all things that

can offend Thee, and make me worthy to appear before the pure eyes of Thy Divine Majesty in heaven, where Thou livest and reignest in the unity of the ever Blessed Trinity, God world without end. Amen.

The Gift of Fortitude

"He that shall persevere unto the end, he shall be saved."

Come, O Blessed Spirit of Fortitude, uphold my soul in time of trouble and adversity, sustain my efforts after holiness, strengthen my weakness, give me courage against all the assaults of my enemies, that I may never be overcome and separated from Thee, my God and greatest Good. Amen.

The Gift of Knowledge

The gift of Knowledge enables the soul to evaluate created things at their true worth--in their relation to God. Give them joys which never end. Amen.*

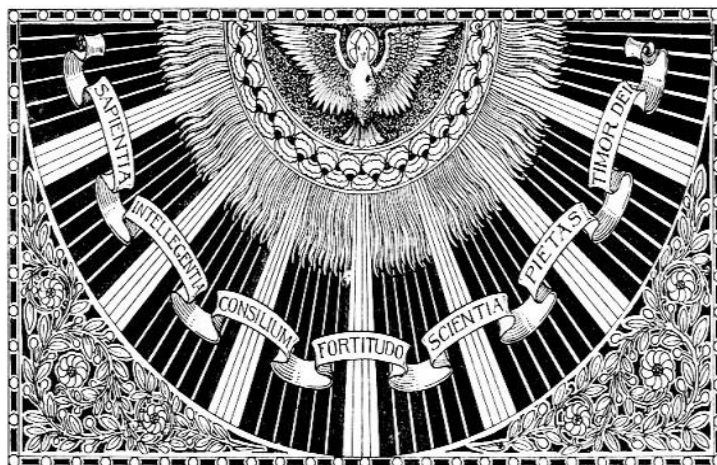
The Fruits of the Holy Ghost

The gifts of the Holy Ghost perfect the supernatural virtues by enabling us to practice them with greater docility to divine inspiration. As we grow in the knowledge and love of God under the direction of the Holy Ghost, our service becomes more sincere and generous, the practice of virtue more perfect. Such acts of virtue leave the heart filled with joy and consolation and are known as Fruits of the Holy Ghost. These Fruits in turn render the practice of virtue more attractive and become a powerful incentive for still greater efforts in the service of God, to serve Whom is to reign.
