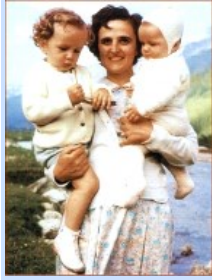

## July - Month of the Precious Blood

*Excerpt from Homily by St. Augustine*

***"One of the soldiers with a spear pierced His Side, and forthwith came thereout Blood and Water."***

The Evangelist speaketh carefully. He saith not that he smote the Side, nor yet that he wounded It, nor yet anything else, but pierced It, to fling wide the entrance unto life, whence flow the Sacraments of the Church, those Sacraments without which there is no entrance unto the life which is life indeed. That Blood which was shed there was shed for the remission of sins, that Water is the water that mantleth in the cup of salvation. Therein are we washed, and thereof do we drink. Of this was it a type when it was said unto Noah: The door of the ark shalt thou set in the side thereof and of every living thing of all flesh shalt thou bring into the ark to keep them alive. A figure is this of the Church. Thus was it that the first woman was made from the side of her husband while he slept, and she was called (Eve, which is, being interpreted,) Life, because she was the mother of all living. This name set forth a great good before it became associated with the bitter fruit of a great evil. And here we have the Second Adam bowing His Head, and the deep sleep of death falling upon Him upon the Cross, and He sleepeth, that the Lord God may take a thing out of His side, and may make thereof a wife for Him. O what a death was His, which quickeneth the dead! What is cleaner than His Blood? What more health-giving than His wounding?

## ***Our Lady of Mt. Carmel ~ July 16th***

### **Scapular Promise:**

*"Whosoever dies in this garment shall not suffer eternal fire."*  
Our Lady to St. Simon Stock on July 16, 1251

### **Why enrollment?**

To be eligible for the *Scapular Promise*, one must be enrolled in the Brown Scapular Confraternity to become an affiliated member of the Carmelite Order. They also participate in the spiritual benefits, merits, and prayers of the entire Carmelite Order.

### **Sabbatine Privilege:**

Appearing to Pope John XXII, Our Lady said : "I, the Mother of Grace, shall descend on the Saturday after their death and whomsoever I shall find in purgatory I shall free so that I may lead them to the holy mountain of life everlasting."

### **The Blessed Virgin attached the following conditions:**

1. Wear the Brown Scapular continuously.
2. Observe chastity according to one's state in life (single or married)
3. Recite daily the *Little Office of the Blessed Virgin* **OR** Observe the fasts of the Church together with abstaining from meat on Wednesdays and Saturdays **OR** With permission of a priest, say five decades of Our Lady's Most Holy Rosary **OR** With permission of a priest, substitute some other good work.

### **The Popes and the Brown Scapular**

**Pope Leo XIII:** "The Carmelite Scapular's nobility of origin, its extraordinary spread among Christian peoples for many centuries, the spiritualizing effects produced by it and the outstanding miracles worked in virtue of it render the Scapular of Carmel commendable to a wondrous degree."

**Pope Pius XI:** "In consideration of the munificent goodness of the heavenly Mother towards her children, it surely ought to be sufficient merely to exhort those who belong to the Scapular Confraternity to persevere in the holy exercises which have been prescribed for the gaining of the indulgences to which they are entitled."

**Pope Pius XII:** "All Carmelites, whether they live in the cloisters of the First or Second Orders or are members of the Third Order or of the Confraternities, belong to the same family of our Most Blessed Mother and are attached to it by a special bond of love. May they all see in this keepsake of the Virgin herself a mirror of humility and purity; may they read in the very simplicity of the Garment a concise lesson in modesty and simplicity; above all, may they behold in this same Garment, which they wear day and night, the eloquent expressive symbol of their prayers for divine assistance."

### **Practical Tips about the Scapular:**

- 1) The Scapular must be worn around the neck.
- 2) One has to be enrolled only once in the Confraternity.
- 3) Worn-out Scapulars are to be burned or buried. When one acquires a new Scapular, there is no need to have it blessed and no need to be re-enrolled.
- 4) St. Pius X approved the Scapular Medal for those in torrid climates and for those with sensitive skin (with same spiritual benefits as the Scapular of cloth).

## Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

**INTROIT:** Ps. 27: 8, 9, 1 The Lord is the strength of His people, and the protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people, and bless Thine inheritance, and rule them for ever. (Ps) Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent to me, lest if Thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit. Glory be. The Lord is the strength of His people...

### COLLECT

O God of hosts, to Whom all that is best doth belong, graft in our hearts the love of Thy name, and grant us an increase of religion: that Thou mayest foster what is good, and with tender zeal guard what Thou hast fostered. Through Our Lord.

### EPISTLE: Rom. 6: 3-11

*A reading from the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans*

Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His Resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if we be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin, He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God; in Christ Jesus Our Lord.

**GRADUAL:** Ps. 89: 13,1 Return, O Lord, a little: and be entreated in favor of Thy servants. Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation.

**ALLELUIA:** Ps. 30: 2,3 Alleluia, alleluia. In Thee, O Lord, I have hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and release me: bow down Thine ear to me, make haste to deliver me. Alleluia.

### GOSPEL: Mk. 8: 1-9

*+Continuation of the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark*

At that time, when there was a great multitude with Jesus, and they had nothing to eat, calling His disciples together, He saith to them: I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have now been with Me three days, and having nothing to eat; and if I shall send them away fasting to their home, they will faint in the way: for some of them came from afar off. And His disciples answered Him: From whence can any one fill them here with bread in the wilderness? And he asked them: How many loaves have ye? Who said: Seven. And He commanded the people to sit down on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, giving thanks, He broke and gave to His disciples to set before the people. And they had a few little fishes, and He blessed them, and commanded them to be set before them. And they did eat, and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets: and they that had eaten were about four thousand: and He sent them away.

**OFFERTORY:** Ps. 16: 5, 6, 7 Perfect Thou my goings in Thy paths, that my footsteps be not moved; incline Thine ear, and hear my words: shew forth Thy wonderful mercies, Thou who savest them that trust in Thee, O Lord.

**SECRET:** Be appeased, O Lord, by our humble prayers, and favorably receive the offerings of Thy people: and that the prayers of none be vain, no one petition void, grant, that what we hopefully ask, we may effectually obtain. Through Our Lord.

**COMMUNION:** Ps. 26: 6 I will go round, and offer up in His tabernacle a sacrifice of jubilation; I will sing, and recite a psalm to the Lord.

**POSTCOMMUNION:** We have been filled, O Lord, with Thy gifts: grant, we beseech Thee, that we may be cleansed by their effect and defended by their aid. Through Our Lord.
