

Transfiguration of Our Lord - August 6, A.D. 2023

VERITATEM FACIENTES IN CARITATE - LIVING THE TRUTH IN CHARITY



From St. Thomas Aquinas' Summa Theologiae Our Lord, after foretelling His Passion to His disciples, had exhorted them to follow the path of His sufferings (Mt 16). Now in order that anyone go straight along a road, he must have some knowledge of the end: thus an archer will not shoot the arrow straight unless he first see the target. Hence Thomas said (Jn 14:5): "Lord, we know not whither Thou goest; and how can we know the way?" Above all is this necessary when hard and rough is the road, heavy the going, but delightful the end. Now by His Passion Christ achieved glory, not only of His soul, which He had from the first moment of His conception, but also of His body; according to Luke: "Christ ought to have suffered these things, and so to enter into His glory." To which glory He brings those who follow the footsteps of His Passion, according to Acts: "Through many tribulations we must enter into the kingdom of God." It was fitting that He should show His disciples the glory of His clarity (which is to be transfigured), to which He will configure those who are His; according to Phil 3:21: "(Who) will reform the body of our lowness configured to the body of His glory." Hence Bede says on Mark 8:39: "By His loving foresight He allowed them to taste for a short time the contemplation of eternal joy, so that they might bear persecution bravely." Christ wished to be transfigured in order to show men His glory, and to arouse men to a desire of it.



Transfiguration of Our Lord August 6

INTROIT Ps. 76:19; 82:2,3 Thy lightnings enlightened the world: the earth shook and trembled. How lovely are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of Hosts! My soul longeth and fainteth for

the courts of the Lord. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, who in the glorious Transfiguration of Thine only-begotten Son didst confirm the mysteries of the faith by the witness of the fathers, and in the voice which came down from the shining cloud, didst wondrously foreshow the perfect adoption of sons: vouchsafe in Thy loving kindness, to make us coheirs with this King of glory, and to grant that we may be made partakers of that same glory. Through the same our Lord.

EPISTLE II Peter 1: 16-19 Dearly beloved: We have not followed cunningly devised fables, when we made known to you the power and presence of our Lord Jesus Christ; but having been made eyewitnesses of His majesty. For He received from God the Father honor and glory; this voice coming down to Him from the excellent glory: This is My beloved Son in Whom I am well pleased, hear ye Him. And this voice we heard brought from heaven, when we were with Him in the holy mount. And we have the more firm prophetical word, whereunto you do well to attend, as to a light that shineth in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day-star arise in your hearts.

GRADUAL Ps. 44: 3, 2 Thou art beautiful above the Sons of men: Grace is poured abroad in Thy lips. My heart hath uttered a good word: I speak my works to the King.

ALLELUIA Wis. 7:26 Alleluia, alleluia. He is the brightness of eternal light, the unspotted mirror, and the image of His goodness. Alleluia.

GOSPEL Matt. 17: 1-9 At that time Jesus taketh Peter and James, and John his brother, and bringeth them up into a high mountain apart: and He was transfigured before them. And his face did shine as the sun: and His garments became white as snow. And behold there appeared to them Moses and Elias talking with Him. And Peter answering, said to Jesus: Lord, it is good for us to be here: if Thou wilt, let us make here three tabernacles, one for Thee, and one for Moses, and one for Elias. And as he was yet speaking, behold a bright cloud overshadowed them. And lo, a voice out of the cloud, saying: This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased: hear ye Him. And the disciples hearing, fell upon their face and were very much afraid. And Jesus came and touched them, and said to them: Arise, and fear not. And they lifting up their eyes saw no one, but only Jesus. And as they came down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, saying: Tell the vision to no man till the Son of Man be risen from the dead.

OFFERTORY *Ps.* 111:3 Glory and wealth are in his house: and his justice remaineth for ever and ever, alleluia.
