Both parents **MUST** attend the presentation by Canon Fehrenbacher in the basement hall on one of these dates. **Registration is NOT available outside these dates/times.**

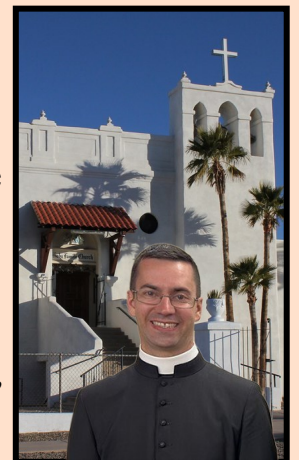
1st Communion : 2 years of class starting at age 5/6

Thought from St. Francis de Sales:

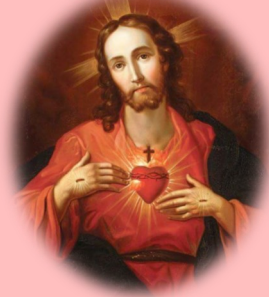

Consecration to the Infant Jesus for the 25th day of each month

Sweetest Child Jesus, under the protection of the Immaculate Virgin, Thy Mother, and of Saint Joseph, today I prostrate myself at Thy feet and to Thee, Jesus, Who in Thy Nativity are given entirely to me, I consecrate my heart, my soul, my whole self in order to love Thee and serve Thee with all my strength. My Divine Savior, I would want to have a larger heart in order to love Thee more. Oh, if I could inspire in the hearts of everyone an ardent love of Thy adorable Infancy! O Holy Child Jesus, grant that all may know the omnipotence of Thy littleness and humility. Instill Thy simplicity and innocence in their hearts, and with all those who love Thee, O Divine Infant Jesus, today I adore in particular the moment of Thy Incarnation. Amen. *O Divine Infant King, have mercy on us and grant our petitions.*





Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: *Ps. 69: 2,3,4* O God, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me: let mine enemies be confounded and ashamed, who seek my soul. (*Ps*) Let them be turned backward and blush for shame, who desire evils to me. Glory be... O God, come to my assistance...

COLLECT: O Almighty and merciful God, of Whose gift it cometh that Thy faithful do unto Thee worthy and laudable service: grant us, we beseech Thee, that we may run without stumbling towards the attainment of Thy promises. Through our Lord...

EPISTLE: *II Cor. 3: 4-9* Brethren: Such confidence we have through Christ towards God. Not that we are sufficient to think anything of ourselves, as of ourselves: but our sufficiency is from God. Who also hath made us fit ministers of the new testament, not in the letter, but in the spirit: for the letter killeth, but the spirit quickeneth. Now if the ministration of death, engraven with letters upon stones, was glorious, so that the children of Israel could not steadfastly behold the face of Moses, for the glory of his countenance, which is made void: how shall not the ministration of the Spirit be rather in glory? For if the ministration of condemnation be glory, much more the ministration of justice aboundeth in glory.

GRADUAL: *Ps. 33: 2-3* I will bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall ever be in my mouth. In the Lord shall my soul be praised: let the meek hear, and rejoice.

ALLELUIA: *Ps. 87: 2* Alleluia, alleluia. O Lord, the God of my salvation, I have cried in the day and in the night before Thee. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Lk. 10: 23-27* At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Blessed are the eyes that see the things which you see. For I say to you, that many prophets and kings have desired to see the things that you see, and have not seen them; and to hear the things that you hear, and have not heard them. And behold a certain lawyer

stood up, tempting Him, and saying: Master, what must I do to possess eternal life? But He said to him: What is written in the law? How readest thou? He answering, said: Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself. And He said to him: Thou hast answered rightly: this do, and thou shalt live. But he, willing to justify himself, said to Jesus: And who is my neighbor? And Jesus answering, said: A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among robbers, who also stripped him, and having wounded him went away, leaving him half dead. And it chanced that a certain priest went down the same way, and seeing him, passed by. In like manner also a Levite, when he was near the place and saw him, passed by. But a certain Samaritan being on his journey, came near him, and seeing him, was moved with compassion, and going up to him, bound up his wounds, pouring in oil and wine; and setting him upon his own beast, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. And the next day he took out two pence, and gave to the host, and said: Take care of him, and whatsoever thou shalt spend over and above, I, at my return, will repay thee. Which of these three, in thine opinion, was neighbor to him that fell among robbers? But he said: He that showed mercy to him. And Jesus said to him: Go and do thou in like manner.

OFFERTORY: *Ex. 32: 11,13,14* Moses prayed in the sight of the Lord his God, and said: Why, O Lord, is Thine indignation enkindled against Thy people? Let the anger of Thy mind cease; remember Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to whom Thou didst swear to give a land flowing with milk and honey. And the Lord was appeased from doing the evil which He had spoken of doing against His people.

SECRET: Graciously look upon the offerings, we beseech Thee, O Lord, which we present upon Thine altar: that while they obtain pardon for us, they may give honor to Thy name. Through Our Lord.

COMMUNION: *Ps. 103: 13, 14-15* The earth shall be filled with the fruit of Thy works, O Lord, that thou mayest bring bread out of the earth, and that wine may cheer the heart of man; that he may make the face cheerful with oil; and that bread may strengthen man's heart.

POSTCOMMUNION: May the holy reception of this mystery quicken us, we beseech Thee, O Lord: and may it win for us both pardon and protection. Through our Lord...

Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary

INTROIT: Hebrews 4:16

Let us come with confidence to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and may find grace in seasonable aid. (P.T. Alleluia, alleluia.) *Ps. 44. 2.* My heart hath uttered a good word: I speak my works to the King. Glory be. Let us come with confidence to the throne of grace.

COLLECT

ALMIGHTY everlasting God, who in the heart of the blessed Virgin Mary didst prepare a dwelling worthy of the Holy Ghost; grant in Thy mercy, that we who with devout minds celebrate the festival of that immaculate heart, may be able to live according to Thine own Heart. Through our Lord ... in the unity of the same Holy Ghost ...

EPISTLE: Eccles. 24, 23-31

As the vine I have brought forth a pleasant odor, and my flowers are the fruit of honor and riches. I am the mother of fair love, and of fear, and of knowledge, and of holy hope. In me is all grace of the way and of the truth, in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Come over to me, all ye that desire me, and be filled with my fruits; for my spirit is sweet above honey, and mine inheritance above honey and the honey-comb. My memory is unto everlasting generations. They that eat me, shall yet hunger; and they that drink me, shall yet thirst. He that hearkeneth to me shall not be confounded, and they that work by me shall not sin. They that explain me shall have life everlasting.

GRADUAL: Ps. 12:6

My heart shall rejoice in Thy salvation: I will sing to the Lord, Who giveth me good things: yea I will sing to the name of the Lord the most High. (*Ps. 44. 18.*) They shall remember Thy name throughout all generations. Therefore shall people praise thee for ever.

ALLELUIA: Luke 1: 46, 47

Alleluia, alleluia. My soul doth magnify the Lord and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Jn. 19: 25-27

At that time there stood by the cross of Jesus His Mother, and His Mother's sister, Mary of Cleophas, and Mary Magdalen. When Jesus therefore had seen His Mother and the disciple standing whom He loved, He saith to His Mother: Woman, behold thy son. After that,

He saith to the disciple: Behold thy mother. And from that hour, the disciple took her to his own.

OFFERTORY: Luke 1:46

My spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior: because He that is mighty hath done great things to me and holy is His Name. (P.T. Alleluia.)

SECRET:

We who offer to Thy majesty the Lamb without blemish, beseech Thee, O Lord, that our hearts may be kindled by that divine fire which so ineffably inflamed the heart of the blessed Virgin Mary. Through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son ...

COMMUNION: John 19: 27

Jesus saith to His mother: Woman, behold thy son. After that, He saith to the disciple: Behold thy mother. And from that hour, the disciple took her to his own.

POSTCOMMUNION:

Refreshed by these divine gifts we humbly beseech Thee, O Lord, that by the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary whose immaculate heart we now solemnly celebrate, we may be delivered from present dangers and obtain the joys of eternal life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who lives and reigns with Thee in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, forever.
