*Veneration of the Relic of the True Cross*

If a reliquary is displayed in a special exposition in the church, it should be distinguished with a place of its own such as a column or table in the sanctuary, a side altar, or some other suitable location. The *Ceremonial of Bishops* forbids placing of relics upon the *mensa* of the Altar, and no exception is mentioned for relics of the Passion.

To not be confused with the adoration due to the Holy Sacrament, reliquaries are never placed in front of, or upon the tabernacle, not even if relics of the Passion. Nor are they to be placed on a throne destined for the monstrance. Before a solemnly exposed relic, at least two lamps are lit. These are distinct from the Mass candles. Only relics of the Passion can be carried with a humeral veil, violet on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, red on other days...
