INFANT KING NOVENA

O Divine Infant Jesus, I have recourse to Thee. Please, through Thy Blessed Mother, assist me in this necessity (**mention intention here**), because I firmly believe that Thy Divinity can help me. I hope with confidence to obtain thy holy grace. I love Thee with all my heart and with all the strength of my soul. I repent sincerely of my sins and I beg Thee, O Good Jesus, to grant me the strength to triumph over them. I resolve never more to offend Thee and I come to offer myself to Thee with the intention of enduring everything rather than to displease Thee. Henceforth, I desire to serve Thee with fidelity and, for the love of Thee, O Divine Infant, I will love my neighbor as myself. All powerful Infant, O Jesus, I implore Thee again, assist me in this need. Grant me the grace of possessing Thee eternally with Mary and Joseph and of adoring Thee with the angels in the heavenly court. Amen.

St. Anne Mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary

THE privileges and graces with which God had surrounded the Immaculate Conception of His Blessed Mother Mary were reflected upon her happy parents, Sts. Joachim and Anne.

Of St. Anne we have no certain knowledge, since she is not mentioned in the New Testament. Thus we must depend on apocryphal literature, chiefly the Protoevangelium of James which dates back to the second century. In this document we are told that Anne, wife of Joachim, was advanced in years and that her prayers for a child had not been answered. Once as she prayed beneath a laurel tree near her home in Galilee, an angel ap-

peared and said to her, "*Anne, the Lord hath heard thy prayer and thou shalt conceive and bring forth, and thy seed shall be spoken of in all the world.*" St. Anne replied, "*As the Lord my God liveth, if I beget either male or female, I will bring it as a gift to the Lord my God; and it shall minister to Him in holy things all the days of its life*" And thus Anne became the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary.



Good St. Anne, mother of her who is our life, our protection and our hope, pray to her for us, and obtain our request. (3 times)

Devotion to the holy grandparents of our divine Redeemer spread almost everywhere in the East. We find that in the sixth century Justinian built a church at Constantinople in honor of St. Anne. The Syrians venerated St. Anne under the name of Dina on July 25th, while other eastern Churches placed her feast on another date.

SEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



Tntroit. Ps. 46, 2. O clap your hands, all ye nations: shout unto God with the voice of joy. Ps. 46, 3. For the Lord is most high, He is terrible; He is a great king over all the earth. V. Glory.

Payer. O God, Whose providence faileth not in setting things in order, we, Thy suppliants, beseech Thee, that Thou wouldst remove from us all things harmful and grant us all that makes for our welfare. Through our Lord.

Epistle. Rom. 6, 19-23. Brethren, I speak a human thing, because of the infirmity of your flesh; for as you have yielded your members to serve uncleanness and iniquity unto iniquity, so now yield your members to serve justice, unto sanctification. For when you were the servants of sin, you were free from justice. What fruit therefore had you then in those things, of which you are now ashamed? For the end of them is death. But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, you have your fruit unto sanctification, and the end life everlasting. For the wages of sin is death. But the grace of God, life everlasting; in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gradual. Ps. 33, 12, 6. Come, children, harken to me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord. V. Come ye to Him and be enlightened; and your faces shall not be confounded.

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Ps. 46, 2. O clap your hands, all ye nations; shout unto God with the voice of joy. Alleluia.

Gospel. Matt. 7, 15-21. At that time, Jesus said to His disciples, Beware of false prophets, who come to you in the

clothing of sheep, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. By their fruits you shall know them. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so, every good tree bringeth forth good fruit, and the evil tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree can not bring forth evil fruit, neither can an evil tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit shall be cut down, and shall be cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them. Not every one that saith to Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doth the will of My Father Who is in heaven, he shall enter into the kingdom of heaven.

Pffertory. Dan. 3, 40. As in holocausts of rams and bullocks, and as in thousands of fat lambs; so let our sacrifice be made in Thy sight this day, that it may please Thee: for there is no confusion to them that trust in Thee, O Lord.

Secret. O God, Who hast sanctioned the diversity of offerings by the perfection of one sacrifice, receive the sacrifice offered Thee by Thy devoted servants, and sanctify it as Thou didst sanctify the gifts of Abel, that what each one hath offered to the glory of Thy majesty may profit for the salvation of all. Through our Lord.

Communion. Ps. 30, 3. Bow down Thy ear, make haste to deliver me.

Postcommunion. May Thy health-giving operation, O Lord, mercifully rid us of our evil inclinations and unto rightful ways strongly lead us. Through our Lord.

Devotion to St. Anne, however, was not diffused in the West until the thirteenth century. A shrine at Douai, in northern France, was one of the early centers of its devotion. In 1382 her feast was extended to the whole Western Church, and consequently she became very popular, especially in France. Her two most famous shrines are that of St. Anne d'Auray in Brittany, France, and St. Ann de Beaupre in the province of Quebec, Canada.

Pope Leo III placed pictures of Joachim and Anne in the magnificent church of St. Mary Major, and in 1584, pope Gregory XIII inserted the feast of St. Anne in the Roman Missal.

The precious relic of the arm of St. Anne was kept and venerated in Rome, in the patriarchal basilica of St. Paul, even in the days of St. Bridget of Sweden, who was given a very small portion of it as a gift. St. Anne then appeared to her and showed her how to venerate and take care of the sacred relics. Later popes Leo

XIII and Benedict XV gave several fragments of this arm of St. Anne to celebrated sanctuaries dedicated to her in both Quebec, Canada (St. Anne de Beaupre) and in Normandy, where God has been pleased to honor them by performing numerous miracles.

In 1879, Leo XIII extended her feast to the Universal Church. Pope Benedict XV visited her chapel outside the Vatican, which marked the first time that a pope had left the Vatican proper since

1870, when the papal states were confiscated by the Italian government.

St. Anne is patroness of housewives, women in labor, cabinet-makers, and miners. She has been frequently represented in art, and the lovely face depicted by Leonardo da Vinci comes first to mind in this connection. Her emblem is that of a door. The name Anne is a derivative from the Hebrew *Hannah*, meaning "grace."

PRAYER TO ST. ANNE

O glorious St. Anne, filled with compassion for those who invoke thee and with love for those who suffer, heavily laden with the weight of my troubles, I cast myself at thy feet and humbly beg of thee to take the present affair which I commend to thee under thy special protection.

Vouchsafe to recommend it to thy daughter, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and lay it before the throne of Jesus, so that He may bring it to a happy issue. Cease not to intercede for me until my request is granted. Above all, obtain for me the grace of one day beholding my God face to face, and with thee and Mary and all the Saints, praising and blessing Him to all eternity. Amen
