INSTRUCTION ON GRACE

IN St. Paul's first epistle to the Colossians (I Col. 12:2-11), the Apostle speaks of the different gifts of the Holy Ghost which He distributes as He pleases. These extraordinary graces which the apostle mentions are not necessary for salvation. But the Church teaches that the ordinary grace of the Holy Ghost is necessary for salvation, because without it we could neither properly believe, nor faithfully observe the commandments of God. For the holy religion of Christ teaches, and experience confirms, that since the fall of our first parents we are weak and miserable, and of ourselves, and by our own strength, we cannot know or perform the good necessary for our salvation. We need a higher aid, a higher assistance, and this assistance is called *grace*.

Grace is an inward, supernatural gift which God through infinite goodness, and in consideration of Christ's merits, grants us to enable us to work out our salvation.

Grace is a gift, that is, a present, a

favor, a benefit. It is an inward and supernatural gift. An inward gift, because it is bestowed upon man's soul to distinguish it from external gifts and benefits of God, such as: food, clothing, health, etc; grace is a supernatural gift, because it is above our nature.

In creating our souls God gives us a certain degree of light which enables us to think, reflect, judge, and to acquire more or less knowledge: and this is called natural light. In the same way He gives our souls the power in some measure to overcome sensual, and sometimes vicious, inclinations; this power is called natural power (natural virtue). To this natural light and power must be added a higher light and a higher power, if man would be sanctified and saved. This higher light and higher power is grace. It is, therefore, called a supernatural gift, because it surpasses the natural power of man, and produces in his understanding and in his will wholesome effects, which he could not produce without it.

Let us take for example, divine faith,

which is a supernatural gift or grace from God, because man of his own power could never receive as certain, God's revelations or His incomprehensible mysteries with such joy and with so firm a conviction unless God assisted him by His grace.

God also grants us grace through pure benevolence without our assistance, without our having any right to it. He grants it without cost and to whom He pleases, but He always gives it in consideration of the infinite merits of Our Lord, in consideration of His death on the cross, and of the infinite price of our redemption.

Finally, grace is a gift of God, by which we can work out our salvation. It is only by the grace of God that we can perform meritorious works which aid us in reaching heaven. Without it, it is impossible for us to perform any good action, even to have a good thought, by which we can gain heaven. From this it then follows that with the grace of God we can accomplish all

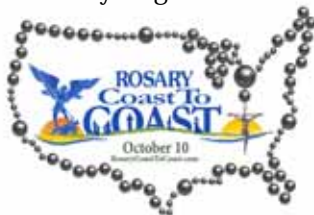

OUR LADY OF THE HOLY ROSARY



~ with Commemoration of the 17th Sunday after Pentecost ~

Introit. Let us all rejoice in the Lord, keeping a feastday in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, for whose celebration the angels rejoice and unite in praising the Son of God. Ps. 44, 2. My heart hath uttered a good word: I speak my works to the King. V. Glory.

Prayers I. O God, Whose only-begotten Son, by His life, death, and resurrection hath purchased for us the rewards of eternal life: grant, we beseech Thee, that, meditating on the mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise.

Prayers II. Grant, O Lord, unto Thy people grace to avoid all contact with the devil, and with pure minds to follow Thee, the only God. Through our Lord.

Lesson. Prov. 8, 22, 24, 32, 35. The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning. I was set up from eternity, and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived. Now, therefore, ye children, hear me: blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates; and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me, shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.

Gradual. Ps. 44, 5, 11, 12. Because of truth, and meekness, and justice: and thy right hand shall conduct thee wonderfully. V. Hear, O daughter, and see, and incline thine ear; for the King hath desired thy beauty. Alleluia, alleluia. V. The solemnity of the glorious Virgin Mary, of the seed of Abraham, sprung from the tribe of Juda, of the noble line of David. Alleluia.

Gospel. Luke 1, 26-38. At that time: the angel Gabriel was sent from God into a city of Galilee, called Nazareth, to a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And the angel being come in, said unto her: Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women. Who having heard, was troubled at his saying, and thought with herself what manner of salutation this should be. And the angel said to her, Fear not, Mary, for thou hast found grace with God. Behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and shalt bring forth a son; and thou shalt call His name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of David His father; and He shall reign in the house of Jacob forever. And of His kingdom there shall be no end. And Mary said to the angel, How shall this be done, because I know not man? And the angel answering said to her,

The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee. And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. And behold thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath conceived a son in her old age; and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren; because no word shall be impossible with God. And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word.

Offertory. Eccus. 24, 25, 39, 17. In me is all grace of the way and of the truth; in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Like a rose planted on the rivers I have borne fruit.

Secret I. Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, to be fittingly prepared for the offering of these gifts, and, through the mysteries of the most holy Rosary, so to meditate upon the life, passion, and glory of Thine only-begotten Son, that we may become worthy of His promises. Who with Thee.

Secret II. We humbly implore Thy majesty, O Lord, that the holy mysteries we are celebrating, may free us both from past sins and future transgressions. Through our Lord.

Communion. Eccus. 39, 19. Send forth flowers, as the lily, and yield a smell, and bring forth leaves in grace, and praise with canticles, and bless the Lord in His works.

Postcommunion I. May we be assisted, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by the prayers of Thy most holy Mother, whose Rosary we celebrate, that the virtue of the mysteries we adore may be shared and the effect of the sacraments we have received may be obtained. Who livest.

Postcommunion II. By the grace of Thy sacraments, almighty God, may our passions be subdued and our eternal salvation assured.. Through our Lord.

Last Gospel. Matthew 22. At that time: the Pharisees came to Jesus, and one of them, a doctor of the law, asked Him, tempting Him: Master, which is the great commandment of the law? Jesus said to him: Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul and with thy whole mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. And the second is like to this: Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments dependeth the whole law and the prophets. And the Pharisees being gathered together, Jesus asked them, saying: What think you of Christ, whose son is He? They say to Him: David's. He saith to them: How then doth David, in spirit, call Him Lord, saying: The Lord said to my Lord: Sit on my right hand until I make Thy enemies Thy footstool? If David then call Him Lord, how is He his son? And no man was able to answer Him a word; neither durst any man, from that day forth, ask Him any more questions.

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things necessary for our salvation, fulfill all the commandments of God, but without it we can do nothing meritorious. God gives His grace to all, and if the wicked perish, it is only because they do not cooperate with its divine promptings. St. Paul here teaches that, nevertheless, this is not to say that graces are not given to all men in the same measure; on the

contrary, He distributed according to His wise Providence. Therefore, we should neither envy those who possess more gifts than we, nor should we be uplifted on account of those we do possess, for God gives to each as many as are useful and necessary for him. Let us then give God thanks, that He gives so many apostolic men for our teacher, who strength-

en us in faith, and show us the way to heaven. Let us also pray that there may some day be one fold and one shepherd and that all the faithful follow Christ on earth, that they may partake of His glory with Him in heaven.
