The Presentation of Our Lady

THE CHURCH this day celebrates the presentation of our Blessed Lady in the Temple, whither she was brought by her parents, Anne and Joachim, at the age of three years and confided her to the care of the pious women employed in the service of the Temple, and whom, according to custom, she was to assist and remain with until she should be of marriageable age. But the holy child entertained views widely different. Enlightened by grace from above, she had already chosen to belong to God alone, and had bound herself to Him by a vow of virginity- the first of all the daughters of Judah!

Our Blessed Lady's sacrifice on the day of her presentation was perfect and entire. She gave up everything for the love of God -the society of her parents, and the goods of the world- all, even the most innocent pleasure of sense, and, by her vow of virginity, the hope cherished by so many of the women of Judah of becoming the mother of the promised Messiah. Her liberty only remained; and that too she gave up, St. Anselm tells us, by a promise of obedience to the high priest Zachary. Thus, her sacrifice was entire, and, what is more, perfect from the love and fervor with which she made it.

The Almighty in return poured out fresh graces upon her, and Mary faithfully corresponded with each and all. This may serve to make us understand how truly the Archangel Gabriel saluted her as "full of grace," "blessed among women," on the day of the Annunciation. But who can form an idea of the treasures of grace, acquired during the long course of years following the Incarnation, with which our Lady entered the courts of the heavenly Jerusalem?

You esteem our Blessed Mother happy in having such pious parents, and in understanding at so tender an age the privilege of thus consecrating herself to God. But had you not also a holy mother, who offered you to the Lord in your infancy, and thus inspired you in later years with the idea of ratifying that offering of your own free will? But if not, at least you gave yourself entirely to God on the day of your First Communion . . . Have you always been faithful? Have you not, little by little, lost sight of your promises? Perhaps bad example has led you into sin, or you may have long lived in certain habitual sins. What an injury to God! What an injury to yourself!

But sadly, how far we are from imitating her constancy! How faithless to our best-grounded resolutions! We seem to make resolutions to God only for the purpose of breaking them. Let us blush for our weakness and take advantage of this feast day to give ourselves entirely and irrevocably to God.

And not only this day, but let us each day to renew this offering of ourselves, because the obligations it involves recur each day. Perhaps we make our morning offering without much reflection, or perhaps make certain reserves as to the use of our tongues, our eyes, or our other senses, or affections of our hearts, which we divide between God and the creature?

LAST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Introuit. Jer. 29, 11, 12, 14. The Lord saith, I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction; you shall call upon Me and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. Ps. 84, 2. Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. V. Glory.

Pray. Arouse, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the wills of Thy faithful, that by more earnestly following after the fruit of the divine work, they may the more abundantly partake of Thy mercies. Through our Lord.

Epistle. Col. 1, 9-14. Brethren, We cease not to pray for you, and to beg that you may be filled with the knowledge of the will of God, in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that you may walk worthy of God, in all things pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all might according to the power of His glory, in all patience and long-suffering with joy; giving thanks to God the Father, Who hath made us worthy to be partakers of the lot of the saints in light; Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in Whom we have redemption through His blood, the remission of sins.

Gradual. Ps. 43, 8, 9. Thou hast delivered us, O Lord, from them that afflict us: and hast put them to shame that hate us. V. In God we will glory all the day: and in Thy name we will give praise for ever.

Alleluia, alleluia. V. Ps. 129, 1, 2. From the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord, hear my prayer. Alleluia.

Gospel. Matt. 24, 15-35. At that time, Jesus said to His disciples, When you shall see the abomination of desolation, which was spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place; he that readeth, let him understand: then they that are in Judea, let them flee to the mountains; and he that is on the house top, let him not come down to take anything out of his house; and he that is in the field, let him not go back to take his coat. And woe to them that are with child, and that give suck, in those days. But pray that your flight be not in the winter, or on the Sabbath: for there shall be then great tribulation, such as has not been found from the beginning of the world until now, neither shall be: and unless those days had been shortened, no

flesh should be saved; but for the sake of the elect, those days shall be shortened. Then if any man shall say to you, Lo, here is Christ, or there; do not believe Him: for there shall arise false Christs and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders, insomuch as to deceive (if possible) even the elect. Behold, I have told it to you beforehand: if they therefore shall say to you, Behold, He is in the desert, go ye not out; behold, He is in the closets, believe it not. For as lightning cometh out of the east, and appeareth even into the west, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. Wheresoever the body shall be, there shall the eagles also be gathered together. And immediately after the tribulation of those days, the sun shall be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of heaven shall be moved; and then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven, and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn; and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with much power and majesty: and He shall send His angels with a trumpet and a great voice and they shall gather together His elect from the four winds, from the farthest parts of the heavens to the utmost bounds of them. And from the fig tree learn a parable: when the branch thereof is now tender, and the leaves come forth, you know that summer is nigh. So you also, when you shall see all these things, know ye that it is nigh even at the doors. Amen I say to you, that this generation shall not pass till all these things be done. Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My words shall not pass away.

Offertory. Ps. 129, 1, 2. From the depths I have cried out to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my prayer: from the depths I have cried out to Thee, O Lord.

Secret. Be propitious, O Lord, to our supplications, and accept the offerings and prayers of Thy people: turn all our hearts unto Thee, that, being delivered from earthly desires, we may pass on to the enjoyments of heaven. Through our Lord.

Communion. Mark 11, 24. Amen, I say to you, whatsoever you ask when you pray, believe that you shall receive, and it shall be done unto you.

Postcommunion. Grant us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that, through this sacrament which we have received, whatever is evil in our hearts may be restored by its gift of healing.

Oratory members both new and old, often ask how they should go about requesting an intention for a Mass. To help elucidate the process and avoid misunderstandings, a simple tutorial has been developed.

The most reliable way to request a Mass is to fill out an envelope which can be found on the bulletin board. Please place it in the collection basket. You may also make requests in person or by phone or email. However, requests made in person are often overwhelming and is prone to error. One envelope could suffice for multiple intentions, unless the donor specifies otherwise.

The name of the requestor will be published in the bulletin and used in the card as written.
