INFANT KING NOVENA

~ said every 17th to 25th of each month ~

O Divine Infant Jesus, I have recourse to Thee. Please, through Thy Blessed Mother, assist me in this necessity (**mention intention here**), because I firmly believe that Thy Divinity can help me. I hope with confidence to obtain thy holy grace. I love Thee with all my heart and with all the strength of my soul. I repent sincerely of my sins and I beg Thee, O Good Jesus, to grant me the strength to triumph over them. I resolve never more to offend Thee and I come to offer myself to Thee with the intention of enduring everything rather than to displease Thee. Henceforth, I desire to serve Thee with fidelity and, for the love of Thee, O Divine Infant, I will love my neighbor as myself. All powerful Infant, O Jesus, I implore Thee again, assist me in this need. Grant me the grace of possessing Thee eternally with Mary and Joseph and of adoring Thee with the angels in the heavenly court. Amen.

Ss. Simon and Jude

IT IS NOT KNOWN WHEN, where, or in what manner St. Simon was called by Christ to be an apostle. Like the other apostles, he became after his call a constant witness of the actions and doctrines, of the humiliation and exaltation of his divine Master, and after the reception of the Holy Ghost, he made himself worthy of his surname, by his zeal in preaching the gospel. He preached the gospel in Egypt and other countries of Africa, and finally met the Apostle St. Jude in Persia, where they both received the palm of martyrdom. St. Jude, son of Mary, who was aunt to the Blessed Virgin, was a near relation of the Savior, and called, according to the custom of the Jews, His brother; he was surnamed Thaddaeus, to distinguish him from Judas Iscariot. Of St. Jude it is also unknown at what time and in what manner he came to be one of the disciples. At the Last Supper when our Lord said that he would manifest himself to those who loved Him, St. Jude asked: "Lord, how is it that Thou wilt manifest thyself to us and not to the world?" After receiving the Holy Ghost, Jude preached the gospel in Judea and Samaria, then in Syria and Mesopotamia. After meeting with St. Simon in Persia, both were martyred; St. Jude was beheaded. His glowing zeal is shown in an epistle which he wrote to the faithful to encourage them to persevere in the faith.

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



INTROIT. Esther 13,9,10,11. All things are in Thy will, O Lord, and there is none that can resist Thy will: for thou hast made all things, heaven and earth, and all things that are under the cope of heaven: Thou art Lord of all. Ps.118,1. Blessed are the undefiled in the way; who walk in the law of the Lord. V. Glory.

PRAYER. Keep Thy household, we beseech Thee, O Lord, with continual loving-kindness, that by Thy protection it may be free from all adversities and devoted to Thy name in well-doing. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE. Eph.6,10-17. Brethren, be strengthened in the Lord, and in the might of His power. Put you on the armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the deceits of the devil. For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places. Therefore, take unto you the armor of God, that you may be able to resist in the evil day, and to stand in all things perfect. Stand therefore having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breast plate of justice, and your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; in all things taking the shield of faith, wherewith you may be able to extinguish all the fiery darts of the most wicked one. And take unto you the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the spirit, which is the word of God.

GRADUAL. Ps.89,1,2. Lord, Thou hast been our refuge, from generation to generation. V. Before the mountains were made, or the earth and the world was formed; from eternity and to eternity Thou art God.

ALLELUIA, alleluia. V. Ps.113,1 When Israel went out of Egypt, the house of Jacob from a barbarous people. Alleluia

GOSPEL. Matt.18,23-25. At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who would take an account of his servants. And when he had begun to take the account, one was brought to him that owed him ten thousand talents: and as he had not wherewith to

pay it, his lord commanded that he should be sold, and his wife and children, and all that he had, and payment to be made. But that servant falling down, besought him, saying, Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And the lord of that servant, being moved with pity, let him go; and forgave him the debt. But when that servant was gone out, he found one of his fellow-servants that owed him a hundred pence: and laying hold of him, he throttled him, saying Pay what thou owest. And his fellow-servant falling down besought him, saying, Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And he would not; but went and cast him into prison till he paid the debt. Now his fellow-servants, seeing what was done, were very much grieved; and they came and told their lord all that was done. Then his lord called him, and saith to him, Thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all the debt, because thou besoughtest me; shouldst not thou then have had compassion also on thy fellow-servant, even as I had compassion on thee? And his lord being angry, delivered him to the torturers until he paid all the debt. So also shall my heavenly Father do to you, if you forgive not every one his brother from your hearts.

OFFERTORY. Job 1. There was a man in the land of Hus, whose name was Job, simple, and upright, and fearing God: whom Satan besought that he might tempt: and power was given him from the Lord over his possessions and his flesh; and he destroyed all his substance and his children; and wounded his flesh also with a grievous ulcer.

SECRET. Graciously receive, O Lord, the sacrifices with which Thou hast willed that Thou shouldst be appeased and our salvation, by Thy mighty love, restored. Through.

COMMUNION. Ps.118,81,84,86. My soul is in Thy salvation, and in Thy word have I hoped: when wilt Thou execute judgment on them that persecute me? The wicked have persecuted me: help me, O Lord my God.

POSTCOMMUNION. Having obtained the nourishment of immortality, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that what has passed our lips we may embrace with a pure mind. Through our Lord.

INSTRUCTION ON THE VIRTUE OF PATIENCE

SINCE GOD HAS SUCH GREAT PATIENCE WITH US, ought not this to move us to have patience likewise with the faults and weaknesses of our fellowmen, and to resign ourselves patiently in all the sufferings and tribulations sent us from God!

Besides, what will your impatience avail you? Will you thereby change or ease your sufferings? Do you thereby correct the faults of your neighbor? No; on the contrary, it makes suffering all the more oppressive, misfortune greater, and the erring neighbor more obstinate, so that he will ultimately refuse even mild and patient corrections. Impatience leads to many sins, to cursing, raillery, quarrelling, contention, and murder.

The pious Job gives us a good example of true patience and resignation to the will of God. He was a wealthy, respected, God-fearing man in the land of Hus, the father of seven sons and three daughters, and lived peacefully and happily. God wished to try him and permitted the devil to vent his entire rage upon him. Job was deprived of his children and all his property, and, finally, he was himself afflicted with the most painful disease of leprosy. But in the midst of all these dreadful misfortunes he remained calm. Clothed with only a few rags, he sits on a dunghill, a picture of misery, and yet no sound of murmuring comes from his lips, he does not curse, does not blaspheme God, but says resignedly: *The*

Lord gave, and the Lord hath taken away: as it hath pleased the Lord, so is it done: blessed be the name of the Lord. To all this misery was added the baseness of his own wife, who came and mocked him, and of three intimate friends, who instead of consoling him, judged him falsely and said that his misery was a just punishment from heaven. Still Job did not murmur against God's wise dispensations; with unshaken patience he faithfully confided in God, and he was nor forsaken. God rewarded him well for his fidelity and patience; for He restored him to health and gave him greater wealth than he had previously. See what patience can do, what reward is in store for it!
