Tavola di San Giuseppe




HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE

How to Request a Mass Intention

The preferred way of requesting a Mass intention is by filling out an envelope, which can be found on the back tables, and dropping it in the collection basket. You may also make requests in person or by phone or email. However, this can, at times, become overwhelming and is prone to error. One envelope suffices for multiple intentions, unless there is danger of confusion.
