## SHORT SERIES ON THE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT: FORTITUDE & FEAR OF THE LORD

Continuing with our series on the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, today we look at the Gifts of Fortitude and Fear of the Lord.

### **FORTITUDE**

In the Summa Theologiae, the Angelic Doctor states that the word 'fortitude' denotes a certain firmness of mind which is acquired in both in doing good and enduring evil especially with regard to evils that are difficult. The virtue of fortitude in man shows that he can have this firmness to obtain goods or fight off evils that are difficult so that he does not give up when trying to accomplish an arduous good, or endure a grievous evil. This is true for many things in our daily life.

But not for all things. Most especially with the work of going to heaven. Sometimes, we are unable to attain the goal of our work. At other times, we cannot avoid evils or dangers to the point of death. Most especially when it comes to the good spiritual work of attaining heaven, the Holy Spirit has to be involved. With His help, we can accomplish our goals (of attaining heaven), and avoid any perils on our way. He works these things in our souls to bring us to everlasting life, which is the reason for which we do good deeds, where we are safe from all dangers. For this end, a confidence of achieving our goal is given to us by the Holy Spirit. By this confidence, we can be sure of overcoming any difficulty that we encounter. This is the Gift of Fortitude.

This confidence given by the Holy Spirit makes the difference between the virtue of fortitude and the Gift of Fortitude that perfects it. The virtue perfects the soul in enduring all perils, but it does not give us confidence of overcoming all dangers as does the Gift. This gift is obtained by humility: acknowledging our weakness before God, and seeking recourse to prayer and the Sacraments.

#### FEAR OF THE LORD

Fundamentally, fear arises in us as a response to an evil.


There are different types of fear, just as we can experience different types of evil. Human fear is that by which Saint Peter denied Our Lord. It is a worldly fear commonly called human respect. It is a fear by which we turn away from God. However, sometimes because of evils we fear, we turn to God. These can be two types of evils: the evil of punishment, and the evil of fault. If we turn to God because of the evil of punishment, this is servile fear. If we turn to God because of the fear of committing a sin, this is filial fear, since it is a fear of offending God our Father. There is also a fear called initial fear that is experienced when we face both these evils at the same time and we turn to God because of them.

Of these different types of fear, it is clear that human fear is clearly not a gift of the Holy Spirit. This is also true of servile fear, even though it is from the Holy Spirit because by it we are only afraid of the evil of punishment. It is still in some way compatible with the will to sin. Thus the Gift of Fear of the Lord is a type of filial fear, a fear of committing a sin, of offending God.

The Gift of Fear allows us to open our hearts to the action of the Holy Spirit, to trust Him in His work of making us into saints. With this Gift in our souls, we no longer resist His inspirations. We have full confidence that it comes from Him, revering God and no longer separating ourselves from Him.

While Saint Thomas does not assign a particular gift that perfects the virtue of temperance we can work out that the Gift of Fear of the Lord serves this purpose since it is the virtue that seeks not to offend God by keeping a control over the disordered appetites. In the end, in heaven, the reverential aspect of the Gift of Fear of the Lord will remain since we will be in awe of the Divine Majesty. The evil of punishment being absent, the fear of offending God will no longer be in our hearts.
