SHORT SERIES ON THE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT: UNDERSTANDING & KNOWLEDGE

UNDERSTANDING

Understanding is penetrating insight into the very heart of things, especially those higher truths that are necessary for our eternal salvation - in effect, the ability to "see" God. In the *Summa Theologiae* (II-II, 8, 1-8), Saint Thomas explains that understanding implies an intimate knowledge, for *intelligere* (to understand) is the same as *intus legere* (to read inwardly). When we try to understand something, we exercise our intellects to know 'what the thing is.' This is opposed to knowledge of things that we obtain through our senses since through them we only know the external qualities of the thing.

There are many kinds of things hidden within an object that the human knowledge has to penetrate to understand. For example, under words lies hidden their meaning (since the intelligible world is enclosed within as compared with the sensible world perceived externally), and effects lie hidden in their causes. However, human knowledge begins with the outside of things, and only if the light of understanding is strong can we penetrate into the heart of things. The natural light of understanding is of finite power and can only go so far. To penetrate further still to come to supernatural knowledge of things, a supernatural light called the Gift of Understanding is needed. This Gift of the Holy Spirit is much needed by us because we are called to a supernatural happiness for which we need to understand higher truths.

The Gift of Understanding perfects the theological virtue of faith whether it is by better understanding revealed truths such as in the Holy Scriptures, or be understanding the great mysteries of God such as those of the Trinity, and the Incarnation. Now we should be careful to precise that the truths of the great mysteries cannot be understood perfectly by us. Even in Heaven, we will only understand it to the maximum of our finite intellectual capacities. However, the Gift of Understanding will allow us to see that these mysteries do not contradict the other truths of Our Faith, and in this way, however imperfectly, our faith is perfected. Moreover, since faith works through charity, the Gift of Understanding will help us in all good actions that flow from the virtue of faith.

KNOWLEDGE

The Gift of Knowledge also perfects the theological virtue of faith. When we assent to a truth, we actually do two things: first, we grasp the truth, and second, we form a judgment on it. The Gift of Understanding helps us with grasping supernatural truths. The Gift of Knowledge helps

us to form a sure and right judgment on them so that we can discern what is to be believed from what is not to be believed.

The Gift of Knowledge also helps with explaining the Faith so as to evangelize and to defend it. It is primarily about knowing, explaining and defending the Faith, but secondarily about our actions by the knowledge of matters of faith, since faith without works is dead (James 2:17), and faith worketh by charity (Gal. 5:6).
